LOCAL LAW NO. #6 OF 2023

“A Local Law to Override the Tax Levy Limit for Fiscal Year 2024”

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Marbletown as follows:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY. This Local Law is enacted pursuant to subdivision 5 of N.Y. General Municipal Law §3-c (the “Property Tax Cap Law”), which expressly authorizes the Town Board to override the tax levy limit by the adoption of a local law approved by vote of sixty percent (60%) of the Town Board.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE. The purpose of this local law is to permit the Town Board to override the tax levy limit on the amount of property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Marbletown pursuant to the Property Tax Cap Law, and to allow the Town to adopt a budget for Fiscal Year 2024 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the “tax levy limit” as defined by the Property Tax Cap Law. Such an override is necessary and in the best interests of the Town.

SECTION 3. TAX LEVY LIMIT OVERRIDE. The Town of Marbletown Town Board is hereby authorized to override the Tax Levy Limit established pursuant to N.Y. General Municipal Law §3-c, for Fiscal Year 2024, and to adopt a budget for Fiscal Year 2024 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in N.Y. General Municipal Law §3-c.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to said clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE This local law shall take effect immediately upon its filing with the Secretary of State as provided in §27 of the N.Y. Municipal Home Rule.



WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that it may be necessary for the Town of Marbletown to exceed the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Marbletown pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c for fiscal year 2024; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Supervisor has prepared a proposed local law to override the tax levy limit for fiscal year 2024 pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and the same has been reviewed and approved by the Town Board members.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby accepts the proposed local law for the year 2023 entitled "Local Law to Override the Tax Levy Limit for Fiscal Year 2024 pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c" for commencement of the local law adoption process; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby schedules a public hearing on said local law to be held on October 17, 2023 at the Rondout Municipal Center, 1925 Lucas Ave Cottekill NY 12419 at 6:00 p.m. and that the public hearing be duly noticed by the Town Clerk as required by law.
