TOWN OF MILTON RESOLUTION 44-2023 APRIL 26, 2023 RESOLUTION ENACTING LOCAL LAW # 2-2023, TO MODIFY TOWN CODE CHAPTER 63 ENTITLED "ANIMALS"

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Planning Board has been reviewing various Town zoning regulations and related laws; and

WHEREAS, it has been suggested by several residents and the Town Animal Control Officer that Town Code §63 regarding animals be modified in regards to dogs running at large in Town parks; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Milton was provided suggested changes to said Code, and believes it to be in the Town's best interest as well as in the best interest of the Town residents to amend said Section; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has caused to be drafted a local law replacing Sections 63-13 and 63-13.1 of the Town Code, and adding new Sections §§63-13.2, 63-13.3, 63-13.4, 64-13.5, and 63-13.6, which Local Law has been placed on the desks of each Board Member, considered and reviewed; and

WHEREAS, the Board had sent said changes out for the appropriate referrals, and caused to have advertised for, and did hold a Public Hearing on the proposed changes, where the public was invited to give comments and input.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Milton hereby approves the modification of current Town Code §63, and adopts Local Law #2-2023, replacing Sections 63-13 and 63-13.1 of the Town Code, and adding new Sections §§63-13.2, 63-13.3, 63-13.4, 64-13.5, and 63-13.6, a full copy of which Local Law is attached hereto, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and she hereby is directed to enter said Local Law in the minutes of this meeting and in the Local Law Book of the Town of Milton and to give due notice of the adoption of said Local Law to the Secretary of State of the State of New York.

§ 63-13. Dogs in Town Parks

§ 63-13.1. Prohibition of dogs running at large in Boice Family Park.

No dog or dogs shall be permitted to run at large at any time, and a dog or dogs must be leashed and accompanied by a competent person having control of such dog or dogs, in or on the premises known as the "Boice Family Park." This section shall not apply to Seeing Eye dogs during such time such dog or dogs are performing the functions for which they were trained, nor for dogs aiding or assisting disabled persons, nor to dogs actively engaged in police work.

§ 63-13.2. Prohibition of dogs running at large in Burgess-Kimball Memorial Park.

No dog or dogs shall be permitted to run at large at any time, and a dog or dogs must be leashed and accompanied by a competent person having control of such dog or dogs, in or on the premises known as the "Burgess-Kimball Memorial Park." No dog or dogs shall be permitted at any time in the playground area in the Burgess-Kimball Memorial Park. This section shall not apply to Seeing Eye dogs during such time such dog or dogs are performing the functions for which they were trained, nor for dogs aiding or assisting disabled persons, nor to dogs actively engaged in police work.

§ 63-13.3. Prohibition of dogs running at large in Cottrell-Harrington Park.

No dog or dogs shall be permitted to run at large at any time, and a dog or dogs must be leashed and accompanied by a competent person having control of such dog or dogs, in or on the premises known as the "Cottrell-Harrington Park." This section shall not apply to Seeing Eye dogs during such time such dog or dogs are performing the functions for which they were trained, nor for dogs aiding or assisting disabled persons, nor to dogs actively engaged in police work.

§ 63-13.4. Prohibition of dogs in Suzanne Lyall Memorial Park.

No dog or dogs shall be permitted at any time, in or on the premises known as the "Suzanne Lyall Town Park." This section shall not apply to Seeing Eye dogs during such time such dog or dogs are performing the functions for which they were trained, nor for dogs aiding or assisting disabled persons, nor to dogs actively engaged in police work.

§ 63-13.5. Prohibition of dogs running at large in William & Marlene Trieble Park.

No dog or dogs shall be permitted to run at large at any time, and a dog or dogs must be leashed and accompanied by a competent person having control of such dog or dogs, in or on the premises known as the "William & Marlene Triebel Park." This section shall not apply to Seeing Eye dogs during such time such dog or dogs are performing the functions for which they were trained, nor for dogs aiding or assisting disabled persons, nor to dogs actively engaged in police work.

§ 63-13.6. Prohibition of dogs running at large in Woods Hollow Nature Preserve.

No dog or dogs shall be permitted to run at large at any time, and a dog or dogs must be leashed and accompanied by a competent person having control of such dog or dogs, when within the Woods Hollow Nature Preserve. This section shall not apply to Seeing Eye dogs during such time such dog or dogs are performing the functions for which they were trained, nor for dogs aiding or assisting disabled persons, nor to dogs actively engaged in police work.
