ORDINANCE 2026-03

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 300 OF THE MISHICOT MUNICIPAL CODE, BY ADDING SECTION 300-5, STORMWATER MANAGEMENT AND PERFORMANCE STANDARDS AND 300-6 EROSION CONTROL PLAN REQUIREMENTS AND PERFORMANCE STANDARDS CONCERNING STORMWATER MANAGEMENT IN THE VILLAGE OF MISHICOT

It is hereby ordained by the Village Board of the Village of Mishicot, Wisconsin, as follows:

SECTION I

Section 300-5 is created to read as follows:

§ 300-5. Stormwater management and performance standards.

Proposed design, suggested location and phased implementation of effective, practicable stormwater management measures for plans shall be designed, engineered and implemented to achieve the following results:

- 1) Sediment control.
 - a. For new development, by design, reduce total suspended solids loads leaving the site by 80 percent, based on the average annual rainfall, as compared to no runoff management controls.
 - b. For redevelopment, by design, reduce, to the maximum extent practicable, total suspended solids leaving the redeveloped site by 40 percent, based on the average annual rainfall, as compared to no runoff management controls.
- 2) Runoff rate control, design standards.
 - a. All stormwater facilities shall be designed, installed and maintained to maintain pre-development peak runoff rates for the following storms:
 - i. the one-year, 24-hour storm event
 - ii. the two-year, 24-hour storm event
 - iii. the ten-year, 24-hour storm event
 - b. Stormwater facilities shall Safely pass storm events in excess of the 100-year, 24-hour storm event.
 - c. All modeling methods, design standards and rainfall depths shall be in compliance with the Wisconsin State Code Chapter NR 216 and DNR requirements for storm water and storm water BMPs.

§ 300-6. Erosion Control plan requirements and performance standards.

All construction activities in the Village shall address erosion control, in compliance with Wisconsin State Code Chapter NR 151 and DNR requirements for storm water and storm water BMPs. It shall be a violation of this article for any condition to be established, maintained, or allowed to be maintained, that results in excessive runoff or erosion to adjacent land, public streets or water bodies. Penalties and remedies may be sought for such activities. Erosion and runoff are excessive when in the opinion of the Village Public Works Director or Village engineer, an unsafe condition results in the streets, undue sedimentation occurs in water bodies, runoff endangers downstream property owners or their property, or the public health and safety or general welfare of the citizens of the Village is harmed.

SECTION II

The terms and provision of this ordinance are severable. Should any term or provision of this ordinance be found to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining terms and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

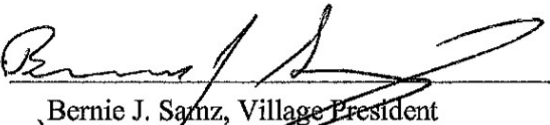
SECTION III

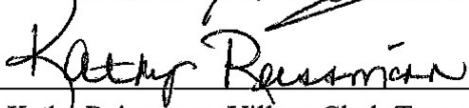
All ordinances and parts of ordinances in contravention to this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV

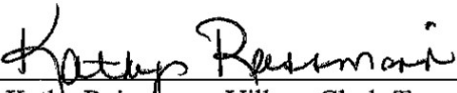
This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption and on the day after its posting.
