AMENDMENT TO THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF NAPLES ALLOWING THE USE OF SINGLE FAMILY APARTMENTS ON THE FIRST FLOOR OF CERTAIN STRUCTURES IN THE C-1 DISTRICT.

Section 385-19(A) Permitted Principal Uses is hereby amended as follows:

1. Section 385-1(A)(1)(r) is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Single family apartments on the ground floor of the structure on premises which do not front on Main Street, and single family apartments on the ground floor of any other structure within the C-1 Commercial District provided that the structure has the architectural characteristics of a residence property and not of a typical commercial structure. 110 South Main Street, now Caruso's Cafe, 120 South Main Street, now The Sutton Co., 130 South Main Street, now Mitchell-Joseph Insurance, and 111 South Main Street, now The Naples Hotel are examples of typical commercial structures within the Village.
