

ORDINANCE 2024:21

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$73,000 FOR THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS FIRE DEPARTMENT EQUIPMENT IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM A FEDERAL GRANT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of New Milford, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of New Milford, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to acquire the following new equipment for the use of the Fire Department in, by and for the Borough: (i) an extractor/washer and dryer; and (ii) turnout gear. Said acquisitions shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$73,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the acquisitions authorized and described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be raised from a Federal grant, as hereinafter provided. The sum of \$73,000 received or to be received as a Federal American Rescue Plan Act Firefighter Grant is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 3. Said acquisitions are lawful capital improvements of the Borough having a period of usefulness of at least five (5) years. Said acquisitions shall be made as general improvements, no part of the cost of which shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 4. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this capital ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.
