Mayor Stewart apologized for the delay in commencing the Council meeting and explained it was due to a special Personnel Committee meeting held prior to the meeting that ran over. Ald. Thornton, Chair of the Personnel Committee, stated the Committee held a special meeting to discuss the vacancy in the Fire Department with no determination made at this time.

-- Ald. Jeffer moved to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes of the regular meeting of September 17, 2002, the special meeting of September 24, 2002 and the work session of October 8, 2002. Seconded by Ald. Clark and duly adopted, ayes all.

OPEN FORUM:

-- **Mary Coe**, 5A Waite Street, praised the Police and Fire Departments with special recognition to the Public Works Department for job done on Waite Street.

BIDS:

Thermal Imaging Cameras -- Three bids for "Two Thermal Imaging Cameras" were opened on September 19, 2002 and a recommendation will be made under the New Business portion of the meeting.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Respect Life-Loveline Procession -- Ald. Clark moved to approve a request from the Respect Life-Loveline Committee to hold a procession down a portion of East Main Street on October 18, 2002 from 7 PM to 7:45 PM under the direction of the Police Chief, as recommended by the Public Safety Committee. Seconded by Ald. Thornton and duly adopted, ayes all.

-- Prior to the vote, Ald. Thornton asked what the Chief's role is when an event is approved under his direction. Chief Angelino explained that for the event noted above his department would place cones in the area that the procession may expand into the street and also barricade the area with a police car in the street to keep vehicles away from the procession area. Ald. Biviano suggested that possibility of issuing parade permits be looked into.

Liquor License Renewal -- Ald. Clark moved to receive and file a notification from Andrew Nicastrì, d/b/a Nina's Pizzeria and Restaurant of intent to renew liquor license at 32 South Broad Street. Seconded by Ald. Rabinowitz and duly adopted, ayes all.

OLD BUSINESS:

Downtown Light Poles -- Ald. Biviano said clarification is needed from the NYSEG Agreement relative to responsibility for the downtown light poles. CD Director Serbin would follow up on the matter.

NEW BUSINESS:

Appointments – Mayor Stewart reported the appointment of Edward C. Nichols of Norwich, NY to the LDC.

Award of Bid – Ald. Jeffer moved to award the bid for Two Thermal Imaging Cameras to the only bidder meeting specifications, Safair, Inc. of Sherburne, NY in the amount of \$ 30,000, as recommended by the Public Safety Committee. Seconded by Ald. Thornton and duly adopted, ayes all.

Authorize Construction Supervision -- Ald Biviano moved to authorize the use of Community Development (UDAG) funds in the amount of \$5,000 to cover the cost of construction supervision for the Hosbach Trail development by the Headwaters Youth Conservation Corps, as recommended by the Finance Committee. Seconded by Ald. Rabinowitz and duly adopted, ayes all.

-- Ald. Biviano asked the status of the bridge design for the trail. Mayor Stewart said she would follow up with Delaware Engineering on the matter.

RESOLUTION # 75 - 2002.

AUTHORIZING DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT
THE LATITUDE TO REQUEST AND PROVIDE ASSISTANCE
DURING THE COURSE OF A MAJOR DISASTER

Ald. Jeffer introduced the following and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, during the course of a major disaster in one or more of the government entities of New York State, said municipality or county may call for assistance from the Norwich Emergency Management Office; and

WHEREAS, this assistance may require said Director or other employees of the City, under his direction, to travel to other municipalities or counties to furnish assistance in said disaster; and

WHEREAS, the Director has requested pre-approval for such work to other governments, in the reasonable expectation that should our City ever require such aid and assistance, it would be forthcoming from other municipalities or counties of the State; and

WHEREAS, the Public Safety Committee has made certain recommendations; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Director of Emergency Management is hereby authorized to travel to other municipalities or counties, with other employees of the City, if necessary, to render aid and assistance during a major disaster and disaster recovery.

Seconded by Ald. Rabinowitz and duly adopted, ayes all on a roll call vote, 6-0.

RESOLUTION # 76 - 2002.

AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN MUNICIPAL GROUP SELF-
INSURANCE PROGRAM

Ald. Biviano introduced the following and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Norwich desires to secure the City of Norwich's obligation to provide workers' compensation benefits through participation in a group self-insurance program of which the City of Norwich will be a member; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Common Council of the City of Norwich, duly convened in regular session, does hereby resolve, pursuant to, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 50 of the New York State Workers Compensation Law and other applicable provisions of law and regulations thereunder, as follows:

Section 1. The Common Council (hereinafter "Representative") of the City of Norwich does hereby resolve to secure the City of Norwich's obligation to provide workers' compensation benefits through participation in a group self-insurance plan of which the City of Norwich will be a member.

Section 2. The Representative of the City of Norwich does hereby resolve to become a member of Public Employer Risk Management Association, Inc., a workers' compensation group self-insurance program for local governments and other public employers and instrumentalities of the State of New York.

Section 3. In order to effect the City of Norwich's membership in said group self-insurance program, the authorized officer of the City of Norwich is hereby authorized to execute and enter into the Public Employer Risk Management Association Workers' Compensation Program Agreement on behalf of the City of Norwich.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect on December 13, 1999.

RESOLUTION # 80 - 2002. AUTHORIZING INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT WITH
CHENANGO COUNTY RELATIVE TO EMERGENCY
MANAGEMENT OPERATIONS

Ald. Rabinowitz introduced the following and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the City of Norwich and Chenango County each have established and, for many years, operated an Emergency Management unit to address natural and man-made emergency situations so as to safeguard the life and property of the citizenry; and

WHEREAS, the parties have recently engaged in discussions concerning the most effective method to deliver Emergency Management services to the public and have determined that a co-location of

a combined Emergency Operating Center (EOC) and sharing or pooling of certain equipment and functions at one location would attain substantial programmatic and fiscal efficiencies; and

WHEREAS, each party has authority under General Municipal Law Article 5-G as well as other laws, to enter into municipal cooperative agreements for functions which each is authorized to perform individually; and

WHEREAS, each party is empowered to operate an Emergency Management program under authority of New York law including but not limited to Article 2-B of the Executive Law and Title 26 of the Unconsolidated Laws of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works and Finance Committees have made certain recommendations; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Mayor be and hereby is authorized, under the direction of the City Attorney, to enter into an intermunicipal agreement with Chenango County for a combined Emergency Operating Center in the City of Norwich Police Department Building at 18 East Main Street.

Seconded by Ald. Jeffer and duly adopted, ayes all on a roll call vote, 6-0.
