LOCAL LAW NO. S., 2024 OF THE VILLAGE OF NYACK

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING §79-3 OF CHAPTER 79
(RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS) OF THE CODE OF THE
VILLAGE OF NYACK, SO AS TO EXPAND THE
LOCALITIES OF RESIDENCY FOR THE VILLAGE
TREASURER AND DEPUTY VILLAGE TREASURER; AND
TO REPEAL THE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES'S
RESOLUTION THAT COMBINED THE POSITIONS OF
VILLAGE CLERK AND VILLAGE TREASURER.

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Nyack as follows:

Section 1 - Legislative Authority, and Supersession:

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to, and in accordance with the procedures prescribed in: (a) New York State ("NYS") Village Law §21-2100; (b) §10(1)(ii)(a)(1), and §20, of NYS Municipal Home Rule Law, which §10(1)(ii)(a)(1) grants to local governments the authority to enact local laws regarding the qualifications of local officers which are not inconsistent with general NYS statutes; and (c) NYS Village Law §3-300(2), which empowers the board of trustees of a village to adopt a local law allowing "any appointed village officer" to "reside within a county in which the village is wholly or partially situated." Additionally, by virtue of the NYS Legislature amending NYS Public Officers Law ("POL") §3, which added a new paragraph "24" exempting any appointed public officer of the Town of Greenburgh from POL §3's statutorily required residency requirements, allowing the appointed public officer to reside anywhere in the State of New York, POL §3 has thereby been rendered, in its coverage of appointed public officers, a special rather than a general law, since, in establishing different residency requirements for appointed public officers in the Town of Greenburgh, it did not, in terms and in effect, apply alike to all municipalities of the State.

This Local Law shall supersede NYS Public Officers Law §3, and invokes the powers of NYS Village Law §3-300(2) and §3-301(1) & (2), in its application to the Village of Nyack for the positions of Village Treasurer, and Deputy Village Treasurer.

Section 2 – Section 79-3 (Residence within certain counties required), of the Code of the Village of Nyack, is amended to read as follows:

§79-3. Residence within certain counties required.

A. Notwithstanding the provisions of any NYS general law to the contrary, and in accordance with NYS Village Law §3-300, the person holding the office of Village Treasurer, and the person holding the office of Deputy Village Treasurer, need not be a resident, nor an elector, of the Village of Nyack; provided, however, that such persons shall reside in, and be an elector of, the County of Rockland, the County of Westchester, the County of Orange, the County of Putnam, or the County of Dutchess, in the State of New York.

- **B.** Upon the effective date of the enactment of this Local Law, the following Resolution of the Village Board of Trustees shall automatically be deemed repealed:
 - Resolution No. 2024-66, adopted on April 25, 2024, which Resolution, in summary, created and established a second position of Deputy Village Clerk-Treasurer.
- C. Upon the effective date of the enactment of this Local Law, the following Resolutions of the Village Board of Trustees shall automatically be deemed modified to the extent only as described below:
 - (1). Resolution No. 2024-65, adopted on April 25, 2024, is modified so as to repeal only the aspect of said Resolution that consolidated (combined) the positions of Village Clerk and Village Treasurer into, and created, the single position of Village Clerk-Treasurer; however, the other aspect of said Resolution that consolidated (combined) the positions of Deputy Village Clerk and Deputy Village Treasurer into, and created, the single position of Deputy Village Clerk-Treasurer, shall remain as adopted on April 25, 2024.
 - (2). Resolution No. 2024-67, adopted on April 25, 2024, is modified so as to repeal only the aspect of said Resolution that allowed the person that holds the office of Village Clerk-Treasurer to not be a resident, nor an elector, of the Village of Nyack, so long as such person resides in, and is an elector of, certain other counties in New York State; however, the other aspect of said Resolution that allowed the person that holds the office of Deputy Village Clerk-Treasurer to not be a resident, nor an elector, of the Village of Nyack, so long as such person resides in, and is an elector of, certain other counties in New York State, shall remain as adopted on April 25, 2024.

Section 3 – Severability

If any part or provision of this Local Law, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part, provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law, or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances. The Village Board of Trustees hereby declares that it would have enacted the remainder of this Local Law even without any such invalid or unconstitutional part, provision or application.

Section 4 – Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing a copy with the NYS Secretary of State in the manner prescribed by NYS Municipal Home Rule Law §27.
