Snow Removal Plan Addendum

12/27/2022

Priority Changes:

Due to limited use on the mega apron on an as necessary basis and priority changes to the existing Snow and Ice Control Plan have been deemed necessary. These changes reflect the Pinedale Airport's ideas on trying to minimize costs in both time and materials while also retaining the total functionality of the airport. The proposed changes are to reduce the plowing operations on the new large aircraft parking area referred to hereafter as the "Mega Ramp". These changes would take the mega ramp from a priority 3 area to an optional area. This area would still be cleared in a timely manner however the requirements to begin operations change. Currently the area requirements are 1" of accumulated snow after priority 1,2 and 3 areas are totally cleared, the adjustment will be to not clear the mega ramp until berms of not more than 36" have accumulated along the sides directly adjacent to taxiway Bravo and Charlie. Once operations are activated the primary objective will be to reduce the berms to not more than 20" and remove snow that is necessary. Total clearing will only occur following a concrete need, seasonal change, or significant time between snowfall of not more than 30 days. After 30 days of no additional snowfall following priority 1,2 and 3 plowing operations the mega ramp may be cleared in order to maintain a sightly and neat appearance for the airport as well as allowing the use of the area. These changes have been made in accordance with the Town of Pinedale, Pinedale Airport Board, and Emblem Aviation who mutually decided that the lack of use does not warrant high priority removal.

Procedural changes:

The current Snow and Ice Removal Plan dictates that the mega ramp be cleared after all previous priorities. The Procedures for the existing priorities will remain unchanged along the mega ramp, the only notable changes may be location of piles created in the process. The mega ramp will be plowed towards with berms expected to form along the edges of higher priority taxiways. These berms will be pushed until clear of the operating area of these taxiways and berms will not exceed 36" in order to mitigate wing strikes of the berm. Accesses will be cleared along the top and bottom of the ramp for vehicle traffic to safely move from the Bravo side to the Charlie side and vice versa. We expect these changes to aid in the fast and efficient clearing of the airport.

Drift control:

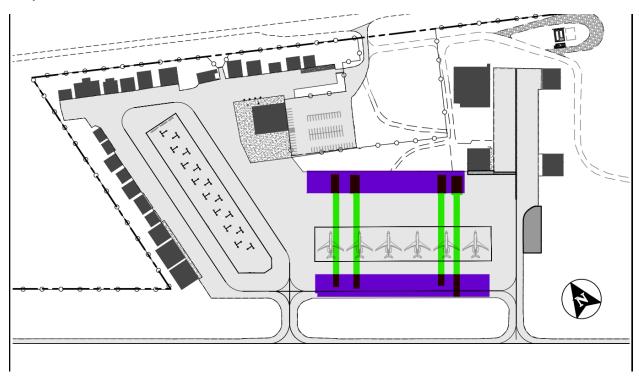
The changes made will not be without growing pains, currently snow drifts are common on the Charlie taxiway. The non-plowing of the mega ramp may increase some of these issues, however, with planning and foresight, snow traps will be formed using the plowed berms in

order to attempt to mitigate drifting issues. These traps will consist of two separate berms of snow between 20"-30" to encourage the forming of drifts clear of taxiways and operational areas.

Master Plan News

The Master Plan for the Pinedale Airport is moving right along. T.O. Engineering recently put together the forecasting chapter. This chapter is the culmination of the last few years worth of data of traffic in and out of the airport. They use this data to forecast into the future about how many expected operations the airport is expected to have as well as designating a critical aircraft. This aircraft is required to have around 500 operations

per year at the airport, our critical aircraft are the Beech King Air and the Cessna Citation. This is important because the aircraft of this type are slightly smaller than the critical aircraft of the last forecasting done in 2010, which was the Global 5000. This change does next to nothing for the airport looking forward, the only notable change being in the event of a major runway reconstruction (which is unplanned for the next 15 years) the runway would be rebuilt at 75 feet wide instead of the existing 100 feet.

Maintenance News

This month the Airport crew has been working on refurbishing the Ralph Wenz airport sign, it has been sanded and is currently being re-painted with the same brown background but a new orange lettering. The top beam will also be replaced and is undergoing maintenance as well. Snow removal is in full effect, with snow plowing and blowing operations consistent in most areas of the airport, which is something to be aware of planning trips this winter. Please note moving forward that I am aware of the problems the East (Charlie) gate has, but if you find it is not working properly please do let me know as it is quite finicky, just let me know and I can get it fixed up for you.

Safety: Vehicles On An Un-Towered Airport

The Pinedale Airport is a non-towered field, and being a public GA Airport there may be vehicles on airside surfaces. So how do you deal with that, whether you are driving a vehicle, operating equipment, or taxing/ flying an aircraft, there are some simple rules to follow.

- 1. Communicate intentions clearly over UNICOM, communicating intentions to any vehicles with a radio is the first step, all equipment that we use to clear or inspect the airport are all equipped with radios, so don't be afraid to talk.
- 2. If you are driving a vehicle, be aware! Remember to stop, listen, and watch. When operating a vehicle on airport property, it is a good idea to roll down a window to listen for the sound of a propeller or turbine so you don't get surprised by a 5 blade Hartzell coming around a corner.
- 3. Maintain a reasonable speed, don't go to fast, whether taxing or operating a vehicle, try to mitigate risk by maintaining a reasonable speed on the ground.
- 4. The Aircraft always has the right of way. It doesn't matter where you are on the field but the aircraft always has the right of way, yield to it, get out of the way, and maintain awareness. I would rather come pull you out of a snow berm on the side of a taxiway than remove neatly sliced pieces of your vehicle from the center of a taxiway.
- 5. Make yourself visible—When operating within airside operations area, a rotating beacon or at the very least your hazard lights are a great idea, make yourself stand out no matter the light conditions.

NOTE: These suggestions are not intended to replace anything your instructor may have taught you. They should be used as a minimum and as discussion topics with an instructor or fellow pilot.



Safety contd.

These rules are guiding ideas to how airport personal operate safely within the airfield, and they might just help you too. If your vehicle does not have some sort of radio or lighting system, it is best to avoid Taxiways and the runway to avoid conflict, and if you need to be within that area for whatever reason I would be happy to take you there, however it is a great idea to keep personal vehicles off of airside surfaces. Keep these ideas in mind, and as always don't be afraid to have a conversation about these ideas. Answers

- 4. False. Wake turbulence descends behind an airplane. The bump felt by the pilot was the result of flying through his own wake at some point slightly below the altitude at which the wake was generated.
- 3. The custom evolved from a maritime rule of the road. It states that vessels approaching each other head on must pass left side to left side. Sitting on the left afforded the best view of the passing vessel.
- 2. B. If the pilot is in contact with ATC then an emergency should be reported on the assigned frequency, if not 121.5 MHz should be used for distress or urgency communication. (AIM 6-3-1(H))
- 1. C. Class C is composed of a 5NM core, a 10NM radius shelf area both of which are charted. However, there is a 20NM radius procedural outer area. Communications with ATC are not required in this area and it is not charted. (AIM 3-2-4, Note 4)
