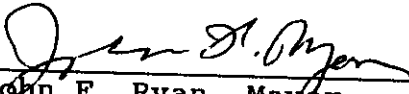

Pursuant to §67 of the Code of the City of Rensselaer I hereby veto the above Resolution which was passed by the Rensselaer Common Council on April 19, 1995 by a 7 - 3 vote, on the grounds that the Resolution is contrary to §28-1(A) of the Code of the City of Rensselaer and Chapter V, Part 570 of Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

I am, therefore, returning said Resolution to you and notifying you that said Resolution shall have no force or effect unless the Rensselaer Common Council shall thereafter reconsider it and pass it over my veto by the concurring vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the total number of Alderpersons in office, which vote shall be taken by the ayes and nays entered on the minutes together with my objections.

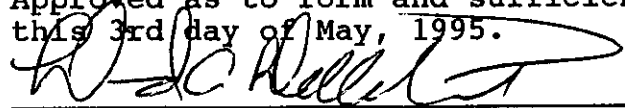

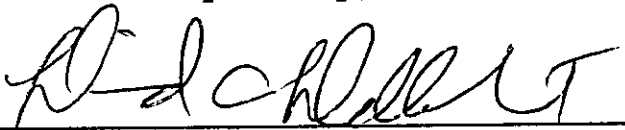
WHEREAS, this Council feels it is appropriate to honor Marine Private James E. Coyne, the first World War I Veteran of this City killed in action in France, and

WHEREAS, the American Veterans' Organizations annually sell Poppies made by war veterans, and

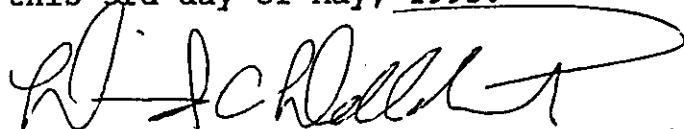
WHEREAS the "Poppy Sale" recalls to mind the great sacrifices our American War Veterans have made in defense of our freedom, and

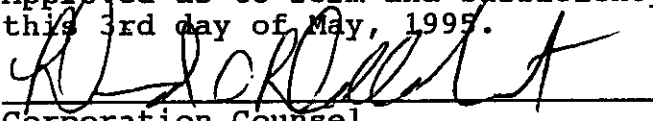

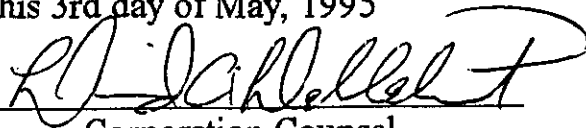

WHEREAS, the City solicited proposals from qualified engineering firms to provide design and inspection services for said project, and

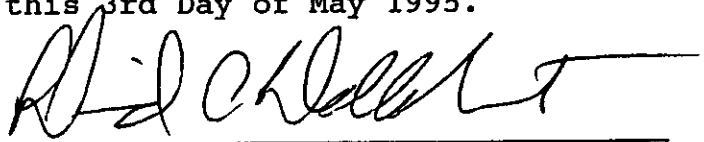
WHEREAS, a Selection Committee was established to evaluate the proposals which were received on April 6, 1995, and

 ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER FOR
 THE PURPOSE OF PAYING A PORTION OF THE COST OF A PUMPER TRUCK

WHEREAS, The Common Council of the City of Rensselaer has heretofore at this meeting duly adopted a resolution authorizing the issuance of certain Serial Bonds in the amount of \$39,000.00 for the purpose of PAYING A PORTION OF THE COST OF A PUMPER TRUCK, and

WHEREAS, there are no Bond Anticipation note or notes outstanding which have been previously issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and

WHEREAS, the Common Council desires to provide for the issuance of Bond Anticipation Note or Notes in anticipation of the sale of said Bonds,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer as follows:

SECTION 1. A Bond Anticipation Note or Notes in the amount of \$39,000.00 shall be issued by the City of Rensselaer for the purpose aforesaid in anticipation of the sale of Serial Bonds of the City in the amount of \$39,000.00 as heretofore authorized by Resolution adopted at this meeting entitled, "RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RENEWAL OF A BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE OR NOTES OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER, NEW YORK IN THE AMOUNT OF \$39,000.00 IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING A PORTION OF THE COST OF A PUMPER TRUCK,"

Said note or notes are not issued in anticipation of bonds for an assessable improvement. No Notes have been previously issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, this note or notes herein authorized being an original obligation.

SECTION 2. The Note or Notes authorized shall be dated and shall mature at such time as the Treasurer of the City shall determine but its maturity shall not be more than one year after its date.

SECTION 3. The Note or Notes hereby authorized shall be executed in the name of the City by the Mayor and City Treasurer, shall be attested by the City Clerk and sealed with the seal of the City. The note or notes shall be in such form as the Treasurer shall determine.

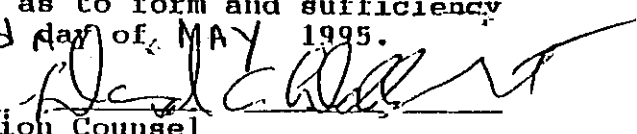
SECTION 4. The Treasurer of the City is hereby authorized and directed to proceed with the sale of said note or notes at private sale at a rate in accordance with the Local Finance Law of the State of New York at such time as the Treasurer shall determine in accordance with the Local Finance Law. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to determine all matters in relation to said note or notes not specifically determined by said resolution.

SECTION 5. The faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said Bond Anticipation note or notes. Said Bond Anticipation note or notes shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale of Bonds in anticipation of which they are issued or may be redeemed as provided by the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 6. The sum of \$39,000.00 appropriated from current funds in the resolution adopted at this meeting authorizing said bonds shall be provided prior to the issuance of the note or notes herein authorized.
