REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTE RESOLUTION DATED
JUNE 1, 1983 AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A
REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTE OR NOTES OF THE
CITY OF RENSSELAER NEW YORK IN THE AMOUNT
OF \$300,000.00 IN ANTICIPATION OF STATE AID
MONIES DUE THE CITY OF RENSSELAER

WHEREAS the City of Rensselaer New York became entitled to collect and receive from the State of New York certain State Aid monies during the current fiscal year, and

WHEREAS the City Treasurer has estimated the amount of State Aid monies in the current budget for the fiscal year commencing August 1, 1982 and ending July 31, 1983 and

WHEREAS, the amount of State Aid money estimated to be received during the balance of the current fiscal year is \$610,000.00,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Section 25B of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York the City of Rensselaer in anticipation of the collection of a specific revenue other than Real Estate Taxes or assessments, to wit, State Aid monies that became due and payable during the current fiscal year, the City shall issue and sell a Revenue Anticipation note or notes in the amount of \$300,000.00 to mature not later than July 31, 1983.

SECTION 2. It is hereby determined and declared that the amount of uncollected state monies against the note or notes to be issued is as of the date hereof, \$610,000.00 and that there are not other revenue anticipation note or notes issued in anticipation of the receipt of said revenue.

SECTION 3. The note or notes shall be issued at such time and shall bear such date and rate of interest not exceeding the Local Finance Law of the State of New York at maturity as the Treasurer shall determine. The note or notes shall be signed in the name of the City by the Mayor and Treasurer and shall be sealed with the seal of the City and attested by the City Clerk. The note or notes shall be in substantially the form set forth in Schedule B referred to in Section 179 of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York. The note or notes may contain such provision permitting its redemption prior to maturity as the City Treasurer, in his discretion, may determine.

SECTION 4. The City Treasurer is hereby authorized to sell said note or notes at private sale for not less than par and accrued interest at a rate not exceeding the Local Finance Law and is authorized to deliver said note or notes to the purchaser who shall not be obliged to see the application of the purchase money.

SECTION 5. The faith and credit of the City of Rensselaer shall be and are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said note or notes.

SECTION 6. The proceeds of such revenue anticipation note or notes shall be deposited and may be commingled with other funds of the issuer in a Bank or Trust Company located and authorized to do business in this State. The proceeds of such note or notes shall be deposited to the General Fund of the City of Rensselaer.

SECTION 7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RENEWAL OF A BOND
ANTICIPATION NOTE OR NOTES OF THE CITY OF
RENSSELAER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$35,000.00 FOR
THE PURPOSE OF PAYING FOR THE COST OF ONE REFUSE
PACKER FOR USE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

WHEREAS the City of Rensselaer has heretofore issued and authorized
a Bond Anticipation note in the amount of \$44,816.00 on the 4th day of June
1982 to mature on the 4th day of June 1983 for the purpose of paying for
the cost of One Refuse Packer For Use in the Department of Public Works, and

WHEREAS, a portion of said \$44,816.00 note will be paid on June 4, 1983
to wit, the sum of \$9,816.00 and a new note issued in the sum of \$35,000.00
on June 4, 1983 to mature June 4 1984, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There shall be issued one Bond Anticipation Note in the amount
of \$35,000.00 on June 4, 1983 by the City of Rensselaer, in anticipation of the
issuance of Serial Bonds of the City of Rensselaer, authorized by the Common
Council by resolution dated June 2 1982, adopted by the Common Council. Said
note shall be issued for the purpose of renewing the Bond Anticipation note
hereinbefore described Neither was the note heretofore issued nor is the note
to be issued for an assessable improvement.

SECTION 2. The note to be issued and authorized shall be issued in the
name of the City by the Mayor and Treasurer and shall be attested by the
City Clerk and sealed with the seal of the City.

SECTION 3. The note herein autho-ized shall be dated June 4, 1983 and
mature June 4 1984.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer of the City is hereby authorized and directed
to proceed with the sale of said note at private sale for not less than par
and accrued interest at a rate in accordance with the Local Finance Law of the
State of New York. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to determine all matters
in relation to said note not specifically determined by said resolution.

SECTION 5. The faith and credit of the City of Rensselaer are hereby pledged
for the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said note. SAId note
shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale of said bonds in anticipation of
which the bonds were issued or may be redeemed as provided by the Local Finance
Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 6. This resolution shall be dated June 1 1983 and shall take
effect immediately
