RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RENEWAL OF A BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE OR NOTES OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING FOR TWO 1982 TRUCKS FOR USE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.

WHEREAS, the City of Rensselaer has heretofore authorized and issued a Bond Anticipation Note in the amount of \$27,332.00 on the 25th day of May 1982 to mature on the 25th day of May 1983 for the purpose of paying for Two 1982 Trucks for use in the Department of Public Works, and,

WHEREAS, a portion of said \$27,332.00 was paid on May 25, 1983, to wit, the sum of \$10,332.00 and a new note issued in the amount of \$17,000.00 on May 25, 1983 to mature May 25, 1984, and

WHEREAS, a portion of said \$17,000.00 was paid on May 25, 1984, to wit, the sum of \$7,000.00 and a new note issued in the amount of \$10,000.00 on May 25, 1984 to mature May 25, 1985, and

WHEREAS, a portion of said \$10,000.00 note will be paid on May 25, 1985, to wit, the sum of \$5,000.00 and a new note issued in the amount of \$5,000.00 on May 25, 1985 to mature May 25, 1986, NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There shall be issued one Bond Anticipation Note in the amount of \$5,000.00 on May 25, 1985 by the City of Rensselaer in anticipation of the issuance of serial bonds of the City of Rensselaer, authorized by the Common Council by resolution adopted May 19, 1982. Said note shall be issued for the purpose of renewing the Bond Anticipation note hereinbefore described. Neither was the note heretofore issued nor is this note issued in anticipation of the sale of bonds for an assessable improvement.

SECTION 2. The note herein authorized shall be issued in the name of the City by the Mayor and City Treasurer and shall be attested by the City Clerk and sealed with the seal of the City.

SECTION 3. The note herein authorized shall be dated May 25, 1985 and mature May 25, 1986.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer of the City is hereby authorized and directed to proceed with the sale of said note at private sale for not less than par and accrued interest at a rate in accordance with the Local Finance Law of the State of New York. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to determine all matters in relation to said note not specifically determined by said resolution.

SECTION 5. The faith and credit of the City of Rensselaer are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said note. Said note shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale of said bonds in anticipation of which the bonds were issued or may be redeemed as provided by the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 6. This resolution shall be dated May 15, 1985 and shall take effect immediately.
