Gentlemen:

We are enclosing two letters from City Construction Company, signed by Mr. Andrew A. Smith, dated August 26, 1971, with regard to the repairs of the sidewalk on the southerly side of the Third Avenue bridge.

One letter advises that City Construction Company proposes to repair the sidewalk as noted, for an amount of \$2,451.75.


The second letter advises that the repairs to the sidewalk which would be made with hot blacktop material be sealed with "Cosmicoat", at an added cost of \$254.64.

The above amounts of money are in accordance with our memorandum dated August 12, 1971. Mr. Smith advises that they are prepared to do the work immediately, and suggests that if it is at all possible, that the work be performed prior to the opening of school, when there will be substantially more traffic on the bridge. It is our understanding that the Council will give consideration to the necessary resolution to progress this work at the meeting on September 1, 1971.







BOND RESOLUTION DATED 1ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1971, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,400,000. SERIAL BONDS TO PAY THE CITY'S SHARE OF THE COST OF THE JOINT CONSTRUCTION WITH THE TOWN OF EAST GREENBUSH OF A NEW WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM FOR THE CITY OF RENSSELAER AND THE TOWN OF EAST GREENBUSH, AND THE RECONSTRUCTION OF AND ADDITIONS TO THE CITY'S EXISTING WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM AND RESCINDING VARIOUS RESOLUTIONS HERETOFOR ADOPTED FOR SAID PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer has heretofor adopted the following resolutions authorizing the issuance of serial bonds to pay the City's share of the cost of the joint construction with the Town of East Greenbush of a new water supply system for the City of Rensselaer and the Town of East Greenbush and the reconstruction of and additions to the City's existing water supply system.

WHEREAS, there are presently outstanding \$2,126,000. bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of bonds authorized by the said resolutions, which bond anticipation notes

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable to consolidate the said bond resolutions authorizing the issuance of serial bonds into one resolution and to rescind the said resolutions heretofor adopted,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer, New York, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be borrowed on the credit of the City of Rensselaer, New York, the sum of \$2,400,000 and general obligation serial bonds shall be issued in the aggregate amount of \$2,400,000., or such lesser amount as may be required for the purpose of providing funds to pay the City's share of the cost of the joint construction with the Town of East Greenbush of a new water supply system for the City of Rensselaer and the Town of East Greenbush and the reconstruction of and additions to the City's existing water supply system.

Section 2. The maximum cost to the City of Rensselaer of said improvements is hereby estimated to be the sum of \$2,400,000. and the plan for financing said cost shall be by the issuance of serial bonds herein authorized in the principal amount of not exceeding \$2,400,000.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of probable usefulness of the object or purpose for which the bonds herein authorized are to be issued is forty (40) years and that sub-division 1 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law applies to such object or purpose.

Section 4. The Treasurer of the City of Rensselaer is hereby authorized to proceed with the sale of said bonds in the manner

the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the date, maturities, form, interest rate and all other matters relating to the bonds herein authorized.

Section 5. The faith and credit of the City of Rensselaer shall be and are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and a tax shall be levied annually on all the taxable property in said City in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same become due.

Section 6. The validity of the obligations herein authorized may be contested only if:

1. Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City of Rensselaer is not authorized to expend money, or

2. The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3. Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 7. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this resolution in full together with a notice substantially in the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law in the official newspaper of the City.

Section 8. All resolutions heretofore adopted authorizing the

reconstruction of and additions to the existing water supply system are hereby rescinded, which rescission shall not be deemed to affect the validity of any outstanding bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to any such resolutions.

Section 9. This resolution will take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RENEWAL OF A BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$47,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING A PORTION OF THE COST OF MATERIALS AND SERVICES IN CONNECTION WITH THE JOINT CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW WATER SYSTEM FOR THE CITY OF RENSSELAER.

WHEREAS, the City of Rensselaer has heretofore authorized and issued a Bond Anticipation note in the amount of \$50,000.00 on the 10th day of September 1969 to mature of September 10, 1970 for the purpose of paying a portion of the cost of materials and services in connection with the joint construction of a new water system for the City of Rensselaer, and

WHEREAS, said note was renewed in the amount of \$50,000.00 in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and said note was dated September 10, 1970 to mature September 10, 1971, and

WHEREAS, a portion of said \$50,000.00 Bond Anticipation Note has been redeemed, to wit, the sum of \$3000.00 on September 10, 1971, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. WHEREAS, said note matured on September 7, 1968 and was renewed in the amount of \$200,000.00 on September 7, 1968 to mature on September 7, 1969, and,

WHEREAS, a portion of said note was paid, to wit, the sum of \$3000.00 on the 7th day of September 1969 and said note was renewed in the amount of \$197,000.00 on September 7, 1969 to mature September 7, 1970 and,

WHEREAS, a portion of said \$197,000.00 was paid, to wit, the sum of \$7,000.00 on September 7, 1970 and said note was renewed in the amount of \$190,000.00 on September 7, 1970 to mature September 7, 1971, and,

WHEREAS, a portion of said \$190,000.00 has been paid, to wit, the sum of \$7,000.00 on September 7, 1971 and the Common Council desires to provide for the renewal of a Bond Anticipation Note in the amount of \$183,000.00, now

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER AS FOLLOWS:

The Treasurer is hereby authorized all matters in relation to said note not specifically determined by said resolution.

SECTION 5. The faith and credit of the City of Rensselaer are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said note. 
SECTION 3. The note hereby authorized shall be issued in the name of the City by the Mayor and City Treasurer and shall be attested to by the City Clerk and sealed with the seal of the City.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer of the City is hereby authorized and directed to proceed with the sale of said note at private sale for a rate not exceeding the amount in the Local Finance Law of the State of New York in accordance with section 60:00. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to determine all matters in relation to said note not specifically determined by said resolution.

SECTION 5. The faith and credit of the City of Rensselaer are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said note. Said note shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale of bonds in anticipation of which the notes were issued or may be redeemed as provided by the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 6. This resolution shall be dated September 1, 1971 and shall take effect immediately.
