I am writing at the request of the Grievance Committee of the Parent Teacher Student Association of the Rensselaer Junior Senior High School to bring to your attention the following matter for consideration:

It has come to our attention that several establishments in the City of Rensselaer are selling cigarettes and alcoholic beverages to minors.

Since this practice has caused considerable concern among parents, students and teachers in our organization, we wish to enlist the cooperation of the Common Council in promoting the enforcement of laws to stop this illegal and dangerous practice.

We are sending a copy of this letter to the Rensselaer Police Department as well as to all business establishments in the city that might carry this line of merchandise.

We sincerely feel that any assistance the Common Council could give in regard to the enforcement of these measures would promote the health and well being of young people in this city and would be greatly appreciated by our organization.

CAPITAL NOTE RESOLUTION OF NOVEMBER 15, 1972
AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF AND SALE OF
CAPITAL NOTE OR NOTES OF THE CITY OF
RENSSELAER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2760.00
FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING FOR LABOR AND MATERIALS
FOR REPAIRS TO ROOFS AT E.F. HART HOSE FIRE COMPANY
AND G.S. MINK FIRE COMPANY.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer, New York
as follows:

SECTION 1. There shall be borrowed on the credit of the City of Rensselaer,
New York, the sum of \$2760.00 for the purpose of providing funds to pay for
labor and materials for repairs to roofs at Hart Hose and Mink Fire Companies,
heretofore authorized by this Common Council, a Capital Note or Notes shall be
issued in the amount of \$2760.00 pursuant to the Local Finance Law of the
State of New York.

SECTION 2. The maximum cost of the purchase and acquisition of such
equipment for which the Capital Note or Notes shall be issued in the sum of
\$2760.00. The plan for financing such costs consist of the issuance and
sale of a capital note or notes in the amount of \$2760.00 and the balance,
to wit, the sum of - is to be paid from current revenues and charged
to budgetary code - .

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that the purpose for which said note or
notes is to be issued, to wit, repairs to roofs at Hart Hose and Mink Fire
companies - - - falls within Section 11:00 Subdivision 11b of the
Local Finance Law and the period of probable usefulness of such purpose is 20
years.

SECTION 4. The City Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to sell
said note or notes at such time as he shall determine at either public and/or
private sale. The City Treasurer is further authorized to determine consistently
with the Local Finance Law AND THE TERMS OF THIS RESOLUTION, THE DATE, maturity,
denominations for all notes or note and all other matters in connection with said
note or notes not herein specifically determined.

SECTION 5. Said note or notes shall be executed in the name of the City
by the Mayor and City Treasurer, certified by the City Clerk and shall bear
the Corporate seal of the City.

SECTION 6. The full faith and credit of the City of Rensselaer shall be
and are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest
on said note or notes and an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and
interest on said note or notes shall be included in the annual City budget and
levied as a part of the taxes for the fiscal year in which each note matures.

SECTION 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
