At the Common Council meeting held on June 20, 1973 a resolution was introduced from the floor by Alderman Bullent regarding the leasing of property from J. J. Keenan located in the sixth ward for use as a teen center by the Rensselaer Narcotics Guidance Council. This resolution was tabled for two weeks to allow the residents in that neighborhood to voice their opinion.

I regret that I will be on vacation and out of town when this comes up again on July third for a vote, so I would like to use this letter as a means of expressing my opinion on the matter.


As a member of the Narcotics Council Committee on the Rensselaer Narcotics Council, I met with Mr. Brayton Russell and other members of his committee and listened to his proposal for this center. After canvassing the city this was the only location they could come up with for use as a teen center. At this meeting we reviewed his proposed budget and recommended it be adopted, and it was, at a special budget meeting held June 27, 1973.

We hear much talk throughout our city about gangs hanging on street corners, broken bottles and glass on the streets, destruction of property etc., this is what Mr. Russell and his committee are trying to eliminate. To me the teenager is the forgotten member of our community.

We have the Boys Club, Girls Club, Little League, Babe Ruth League and hopefully Pop Warner Football in the fall, but where do the teenagers fit into these programs? At our meeting with Mr. Russell and his Committee I told him I would support this project as I thought it was a cheap investment if it gave our teenagers some place to meet and enjoy themselves.

At this point I would like to reaffirm my support for Mr. Russell and his Committee and urge you my fellow aldermen to do likewise. If I were to be present at the meeting on July third, I would vote in favor of leasing this property and I strongly urge you to do likewise.

RESOLUTION NO. 157/73

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A KEEP RENSSELAER
COUNTY CLEAN COMMISSION AND DESIGNATING A
COORDINATOR FOR KEEP RENSSELAER COUNTY
CLEAN PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the New York State Council of Environmental Advisors has commenced a state-wide anti-litter program, the avowed purpose of which is to clean up communities and to encourage continued citizen interest in maintaining a better environment, and

WHEREAS, this program has been organized on a county by county basis, with local coordinators responsible for recruiting leaders and volunteer workers, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Rensselaer County Legislature that Rensselaer County participate in this state-wide program, and

WHEREAS, Rensselaer County presently has an ongoing program of beautification under the auspices of the Emergency Employment Act, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed appropriate that a Keep Rensselaer County Clean Program should be coordinated with the existing beautification program, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that a special commission is hereby established and shall be known as the Keep Rensselaer County Clean Commission, consisting of the following:

- (1) One member of the Rensselaer County Legislature, elected by the Legislature and designated as Chairman of the Commission.
- (2) One representative from the Cities of Rensselaer and Troy designated by the respective City Councils.
- (3) One representative from each of the 14 towns in the County of Rensselaer each to be designated by the respective town boards.
- (4) One representative from each of the 5 villages of Rensselaer County designated by the Mayor of the respective villages.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that each of the representatives of the County, cities, towns and village governments be designated as deputy coordinators, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said commission be convened within thirty (30) days after the adoption of this resolution and that said commission is hereby authorized to coordinate the Rensselaer County Keep Clean Program with the Keep New York State Clean Program and to make periodic reports to this Legislature as to the progress of this program.
