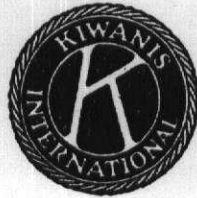

Dear Mr. Leahey:

The Kiwanis Club of Rensselaer, N. Y. respectfully submits to the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer, New York, the attached petition containing 410 names, requesting that the possibility of moving the home of the late Dr. Thomas W. Phelan from its present site to a new location to become the Public Library of the City of Rensselaer, be considered by the members of the Common Council.

Members of the Kiwanis Club have made a preliminary survey which includes the cost of relocation of the building, the cost of a new foundation, and the cost of reconditioning the building for library purposes. This survey indicates that this structure can be relocated at an expense which is well within reasonable limits. We intend to continue our efforts to acquire more detailed information on the various points to be considered.

The response, on the part of the citizens of Rensselaer, to our resolution, passed at our meeting on August 18th, has been overwhelmingly in favor of our proposal. It has not been possible, at the present time, to reach the growing number of people who desire to endorse our resolution. The sentiment expressed by a great majority, besides halting demolition of the home and investigating all angles, includes a persistent effort be made on the part of those in positions of responsibility to bring this movement forward to a successful conclusion, an economically possible and suitable library for the people of the city of Rensselaer.
