LOCAL LAW NO. 1 FOR THE YEAR 1953

A LOCAL LAW OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER IN RELATION TO LIABILITY OF CITY IN CERTAIN ACTIONS, AMENDING SECTION 78 OF CHAPTER 69 OF THE LAWS OF 1915 ENTITLED, "AN ACT TO REVISE THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER."

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer as follows:

SECTION 1. SECTION 78, ENTITLED, "LIABILITY OF CITY IN CERTAIN ACTIONS", OF CHAPTER 69 OF THE LAWS OF 1915, IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 78. LIABILITY OF CITY IN CERTAIN ACTIONS.

1. No civil action shall be maintained against the City for damages or injuries to person or property sustained in consequence of any street, highway, tree, bridge, culvert, curb, sewer, sidewalk or crosswalk being defective, out of repair, unsafe, dangerous or obstructed unless a prior written notice of the defective, unsafe, dangerous, or obstructed condition of such street, highway, tree, bridge, culvert, curb, sewer, sidewalk or crosswalk was actually given to the City Engineer, Commissioner of Public Works or City Clerk, and that there was a failure of neglect within a reasonable time thereafter and before the accident, to remedy the condition complained of.

2. No Civil action shall be maintained against the City for damages or injuries to the person sustained solely in consequence of the existence of snow or ice upon any sidewalk, crosswalk, curb or street unless written notice thereof relating to the particular place was actually given to the (commissioner of public works and there was a failure or neglect to cause such snow or ice to be removed, or the place otherwise made reasonably safe within a reasonable time after the receipt of such notice.

3. The City shall not be liable in a civil action for damages or injuries to person or property, or invasion of personal or property rights, of any name or nature whatsoever, whether casual or continuing, arising at law or in equity, alleged to have been caused or sustained in whole or in part, by or because of any omission of duty, wrongful act, fault, neglect, misfeasance or negligence on the part of the City, or any of its agents, officers or employees, unless a claim therefor in writing, pursuant to and in compliance with the provisions of Section 50e of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, be served upon the City; nor unless an action shall be commenced thereon within one year after the happening of such accident or injury or the occurrence of such act, omission, fult, or neglect; but no action shall be commenced to recover upon or the enforcement of any such claim against the City until the expiration of three months after the service of said notice upon th. City. Nothing herein contained, however, shall be held to revive any claim or cause of action now barred by any existing requirement or statute of limitation nor to waive any existing limitation now applicable to any claim or cause of action against the City.

4. Nothing herein contained, however, shall be deemed to repeal or in any wise affect the validity of the provisions of Section 50e of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 2. The provisions of this section, as hereby amended, shall not apply to any right of action which accrued prior to the adoption of this local law.

SECTION 3. If any section, part of section, sentence, clause or phrase of this local law shall be adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining provisions hereof shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. This local law shall take effect immediately.

Honorable Thomas S. H. Clark,
Mayor of the City of Rensselaer, and
Members of the Board of Aldermen.

Dear Sirs:

In view of the negotiations that are presently taking place, pertaining to the procurement of a new source of domestic water, I feel it is my duty to call your attention to the relationship between Civil Defense and our water supply.

Our principal Civil Defense preparations are directed to the reduction of fatalities of our Rensselaer residents in the event the target City of Albany sustains an atomic attack.

Should Albany be subjected to such an attack, the resultant damage to our City would be generally as follows:

- (a) practically all dwellings and other structures, including the water pumping station on the bank of the Hudson River would be demolished
- (b) Many fires would develop and spread
- (c) There would be many injured persons among the ruins hoping to be rescued before the spreading fires reached them.

It is obvious that the fire problem would be our most serious task and unless the fires are controlled, the medical, rescue and other Civil Defense forces could not work in the area. The fires could not be controlled if water was not available at the hydrants.

I feel that most of our Civil Defense preparations would be useless unless our water supply entered the City from the east, namely, via Washington Avenue, and Third Avenue. In which event there would be reasonable assurance that water supply for fire fighting purposes would not be destroyed in the event of an atomic strike on the City of Albany.

The information I have been able to obtain concerning the possibility of bringing water from the City of Troy is to the effect that it would be brought through a line near the railroad tracks and into the pumping station which, in turn, would distribute it throughout the City. I seriously urge that if water is obtained from the City of Troy it be piped in the vicinity of the Troy Road so that the pumping station located on the bank of the Hudson may be dispensed with.
