S.50-f. Recording of notice of claim

1. Whenever a notice of claim is required by section fifty-e of this chapter as a condition precedent to the commencement of an action or proceeding against a municipal corporation, or any officer, appointee or employee thereof, every municipal corporation shall make and keep a record, numbered consecutively and indexed alphabetically according to the name of the claimant, of each notice of claim filed in compliance with such requirement and of the disposition of the claim so noticed. The record shall be made and kept by an officer or employee designated for that purpose by the governing body of the municipal corporation. In the absence of such designation the record shall be kept by the clerk, except in the counties, where it shall be kept by the clerk of the board of supervisors, and except in the city of New York, where it shall be kept by the comptroller or a person designated by him for that purpose. The record of each claim shall be preserved for a period of five years after the date of the final disposition thereof.

2. The record shall set forth: (1) the name and post-office address of the claimant and of his attorney, if any; (2) the date of service; (3) the time, place and manner of injury; (4) the nature of the injury and amount claimed; (5) whether the claim was approved or disapproved with the date; (6) whether referred to an insurance carrier, with the date; (7) the carrier's disposition of the claim with the date; (8) the date of service of a complaint; (9) the date and result of any trial; (10) the date and result of any appeal; (11) the date and amount of any settlement; (12) the date and amount of any judgment paid; (13) the reason and date the file was closed.

LOCAL LAW NO. 6 FOR THE YEAR 1956

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING SECTION 263 OF CHAPTER 69 OF THE LAWS OF 1915 ENTITLED "AN ACT TO REVISE THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER" IN RELATION TO THE LAW DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY, AMENDING GENERALLY SECTION 263 OF THE CHAPTER 69 OF THE LAWS OF 1915, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO REVISE THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER"

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 263 of Chapter 69 of the Laws of 1915 entitled "An Act to Revise The Charter Of The City of Rensselaer", is hereby superseded and enacted as Local Law and amended, to read as follows:

SECTION 263. LAW DEPARTMENT. The Corporation Counsel shall be the head of the Department of Law. He may appoint, to hold office during his pleasure, an assistant Corporation Counsel and such other subordinates as may be prescribed by the Common Council. The assistant Corporation Counsel shall have such powers and perform such duties as may from time to time be assigned to him by the Corporation Counsel. In case of the absence or disability of the Corporation Counsel, or of a vacancy in the office, the assistant Corporation Counsel shall discharge the duties of the office until the Corporation Counsel returns, his disability ceases, or the vacancy is filled. The Corporation Counsel and the assistant Corporation Counsel, before entering upon the discharge of the duties of their respective office, shall each execute and file with the City Clerk the Oath of Office required by Section 30 of the Charter of the City of Rensselaer.

SECTION 2. This Local Law shall take effect immediately.
