RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RENEWAL OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES MATURING SEPTEMBER 20, 1958 ISSUED IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS OF THE CITY OF RENSSELAER, NEW YORK FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING A PORTION OF THE COST OF RESURFACING RIVERSIDE AVENUE SOUTH FROM ALBANY PORT DISTRICT COMMISSION TO SOUTH CITY LINE.

WHEREAS, the City of Rensselaer, New York as heretofore issued its Bond Anticipation Notes in the sum of Fifty-two thousand (\$52,000.00) Dollars on various dates mature September 20, 1958 pursuant to Resolution Number 90 adopted by this Common Council, in the anticipation of the issuance of Serial Bonds of the City for the purpose of paying a portion of the cost to pave and/or resurface Riverside Avenue South from Albany Port District Commission to South City Line with Bituminous Macadam and to construct thereon storm sewers including necessary appurtenances, which resolution was dated September 18, 1957, authorizing the issuance of \$68,000.00 Bond Anticipation Note or Notes of the City of Rensselaer, New York in anticipation of the issuance of \$68,000.00 Serial Bonds of the City of Rensselaer for the purpose of paying a portion of the cost to pave and/or resurface Riverside Avenue.

WHEREAS, The following notes have been issued, to wit:

WHEREAS, the Common Council desires to provide for the renewal of said Bond Anticipation Notes, now therefore be it,

RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer, New York, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be issued one Bond Anticipation Note in the amount of \$52,000.00 by the City of Rensselaer in Anticipation of the sale of Serial Bonds of the City as authorized by the two above mentioned resolutions adopted by this Common Council, said note shall be issued for the purpose of renewing the bond anticipation notes hereinbefore described. None of the notes heretofore issued nor the note herein authorized are or is issued in anticipation of the sale of bonds for an assessable improvement.

Section 2. The note herein authorized shall be dated September 20, 1958 and shall mature September 20, 1959.

Section 3. The note hereby authorized shall be issued in the name of the City by the Mayor and Treasurer, shall be attested by the City Clerk and shall be sealed with the Seal of the City.

Section 4. The Treasurer of the City is hereby authorized and directed to proceed with the sale of said note at private sale for not less than par and accrued interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum (5%) per annum at such time as the Treasurer shall determine, in accordance with Section 60:00 of the Local Finance Law. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to determine all matters in relation to said note not specifically determined by said resolution

Section 5. The faith and credit of said city are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said Bond Anticipation Notes. Said Bond Anticipation Note shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale of Bonds in anticipation of which the notes were issued or may be redeemed as provided by the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 6. This resolution shall be dated September 3, 1958 and shall take effect immediately.
