CAPITAL NOTE RESOLUTION OF AUGUST 6, 1958 AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE AND SALE OF CAPITAL NOTE OR NOTES OF THE CITY OF BENNSSELAER, NEW YORK, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$600.00 TO DEFRAY THE COST OF A STANDARD PRECISE TRANSIT AND EXTENSION TRIPOD.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Benseelaer, New York, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be borrowed on the credit of the City of Benseelaer, New York, the sum of Six Hundred and no/100th (\$600.00) Dollars for the purpose of defraying the cost of a Standard Precise Transit and Extension Tripod.

Section 2. The maximum cost of said equipment, to provide funds for which the said Capital Note shall be issued is estimated to be the sum of \$670.00 and the plan for financing such costs consists of the issuance and sale of the said note or notes in the Amount of \$600.00 with the balance of such cost to be paid from current budget appropriations and charged to item 270 H of the budget for the current fiscal year in which item there is now an unexpended balance.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the purpose for which said note or notes is to be issued to wit; to defray the cost of a standard precise transit and extension tripod falls within Section 11 paragraph (a) subsection 32 (Equipment, machinery, apparatus or furnishings) of the Local Finance Law and that the period of probable usefulness of such purposes is five years.

Section 4. The City Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to sell said note or notes at such time or times as he shall determine at either public or private sale. The City Treasurer is further authorized to determine consistently with the Local Finance Law and the terms of this resolution, the date, maturity, denominations, form and all other matters in connection with said note or notes not herein specifically determined.

Section 5. Said note shall be executed in the name of the City by the Mayor and the City Treasurer and shall bear the corporate seal of the City.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the City of Benseelaer shall be and are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said note or notes and an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said note or notes shall be included in the annual budget and levied as a part of the taxes for the fiscal year in which each such note matures.

Section 7: Pursuant to Section 165-B of the Local Finance Law the proceeds of such Capital Note or Notes need not be deposited in a special account but may be commingled with other funds of the issuer in a bank or trust company located and authorized to do business in this State. The proceeds of such Capital Note or Notes, may be deposited to the improvement fund of the City of Benseelaer, New York in the National Commercial Bank and Trust Company of Albany.

Section 8. This resolution shall be dated August 6, 1958 and shall take effect immediately.

Section 1. There shall be borrowed on the credit of the City of Rensselaer, New York, the sum of Three Thousand and no/100th (\$3000.00) Dollars for the purpose of defraying the cost of engineering services in connection with the preparation of Plans and Specifications for Ground Water Exploration, Supervision of Construction at the Filter plant and for an electric resistivity survey and the drilling and testing of 8" test holes.

Section 2. The maximum cost of said services to provide funds for which the said Capital Note shall be issued is estimated to be the sum of \$3,170.15, and the plan for financing such cost consists of the issuance and sale of the said note or notes in the amount of \$3000.00 with the balance of such cost to be paid from current budget appropriations and charged to item 270 H of the budget for the current fiscal year in which item there is now an unexpended balance.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the purpose for which said note or notes is to be issued to wit: to defray the cost of engineering services and an electric-resistivity survey together with drilling and testing 8" test holes falls within Section 11 paragraph (a) subsection 1. (water systems) of the Local Finance Law and that the period of probable usefulness of such purpose is forty years.

Section 4. The City Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to sell said note or notes at such time or times as he shall determine at either public or private sale. The City Treasurer is further authorized to determine consistently with the Local Finance Law and the terms of this resolution, the date, maturity, denominations, form and all other matters in connection with said note or notes not herein specifically determined.

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING
REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE
INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE
OF OUTDOOR WATER POOLS IN THE
CITY OF RENSSELAER; PROVIDING
FOR REGULATION, CONTROL, AND
AND ENFORCEMENT THEREOF: PRO-
VIDING PENALTIES FOR THE
VIOLATION THEREOF AND RE-
PEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES
OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN-
CONSISTENT HEREWITH

*Pratt moved for adoption
2nd time*

THE CITY OF RENSSELAER, IN COMMON COUNCIL CONVENED,
ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. An outdoor water pool shall for the purpose of this ordinance be construed to mean any swimming pool, tank depression or excavation or other structure which shall cause the retaining of water to a greater depth than twenty-four (24) inches. The word "pool" shall be construed to mean outdoor water pool.

SECTION 2. No outdoor water pool shall be constructed, erected or maintained unless a permit for the same shall have been issued by the Building Commissioner of the City of Rensselaer. An application for such permit shall be on such form as may be furnished by the Building Commissioner of the City of Rensselaer and shall be accompanied by complete plans and specifications of the pool, the plan for the disposal of water, the type and location of fencing and a survey or map showing the location thereof with respect to the boundary lines of the land of the applicant. Permits may be issued only upon application of the owner of the land or his agent duly authorized in writing to make such application. Application shall be accompanied by a permit fee in the sum of \$25.00.

SECTION 3. Materials of Construction. No pool shall be built, constructed or maintained except of materials having adequate strength to retain the water designed to be contained therein. Each pool shall be designed in accordance with sound engineering practice.

SECTION 4. Water Disposal. Water overflowing from the pool and when the pool is emptied, the water therefrom shall be disposed of on the Owner's land and shall be prevented from flowing over or into the land of any adjoining property owner or over or into any abutting street or into any sanitary sewer.

SECTION 5. Fencing. Every pool shall be completely enclosed with fencing of a height not less than four feet nor more than six feet to prevent accidental entry and unauthorized use of the pool. The building Commissioner of the City of Rensselaer may prescribe the method and type of fencing which will in the opinion of the Building Commissioner safeguard the public, health, safety and general welfare. In making such determination the Building Commissioner shall take into consideration the character of the district with a view to conserving the value of buildings and land and encouraging the most appropriate use of land within the municipality.

SECTION 6. There shall be a perimeter of at least four feet around said pool which perimeter shall be between the edge of the pool and the fence erected around the pool.

SECTION 7. No lighting shall be permitted, in, on or about said pool, except such lighting that shall shine into or upon said pool and cast no light or reflections on to abutting properties.

SECTION 8. Abandonment. Should the Owner abandon the pool, he shall arrange to remove the depression and return the surface of the ground to its original grade and approximately in the same condition as before the pool was constructed, and he shall further notify the Building Commissioner of the City of Rensselaer, of the abandonment so that the inspection of the site may be made and the records of the permit be marked accordingly.

SECTION 9. Distance from lot lines. Every pool shall be constructed at least ten feet distant from any lot line.

SECTION 10. Enforcement. The building inspector shall be empowered to enforce the regulation herein set forth and to compel the removal of any pool that fails to meet the requirements as to installation or proper maintenance of the pool, fencing, water disposal and appurtenances.

SECTION 11. The owner of any land upon which a pool shall be constructed prior to the date of adoption of this ordinance and pursuant to a permit duly issued by the Building Commissioner of the City of Rensselaer shall within ninety days after the effective date of this ordinance comply with the requirements contained in Sections 4, 5 and 8 hereof.

SECTION 12. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 13. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer, New York, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be borrowed on the credit of the City of Rensselaer, New York, the sum of Three Thousand and no/100ths (\$3000.00) Dollars for the purpose of defraying the cost of engineering services in connection with the preparation of Plans and Specifications for Ground Water Exploration, Supervision of Construction at the Filter plant and for an electric-resistivity survey and the drilling and testing of 8" test holes.

Section 2. The maximum cost of said services to provide funds for which the said Capital Note shall be issued is estimated to be the sum of \$3, 170.15, and the plan for financing such costs consists of the issuance and sale of the said note or notes in the amount of \$3000.00 with the balance of such cost to be paid from current budget appropriations and charged to item 270M of the budget for the current fiscal year in which item there is now an unexpended balance.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the purpose for which said note or notes is to be issued to wit: to defray the cost of engineering services and and electric-resistivity survey together with drilling and testing 8" test holes falls within Section 11 paragraph (a) subsection 1. (water systems) of the Local Finance Law and that the period of probable usefulness of such purpose is forty years.

Section 4. The City Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to sell said note or notes at such time or times as he shall determine at either public or private sale. The City Treasurer is further authorized to determine consistently with the Local Finance Law and the terms of this resolution, the date, maturity, denominations, form and all other matters in connection

with said note or notes not herein specifically determined.

Section 5. Said note shall be executed in the name of the City by the Mayor and the City Treasurer and shall bear the corporate seal of the City.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the City of Rensselaer shall be and are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said note or notes and an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said note or notes shall be included in the annual budget and levied as a part of the taxes for the fiscal year in which each such note matures.

Section 7: Pursuant to Section 165-B of the Local Finance Law the proceeds of such Capital Note or notes need not be deposited in a special account but may be commingled with other funds of the issuer in a bank or trust company located and authorized to do business in this State. The proceeds of such Capital Note or Notes, may be deposited to the improvement fund of the City of Rensselaer, New York in the National Commercial Bank and Trust Company of Albany.

Section 8. This resolution shall be dated August 6, 1958 and shall take effect immediately.
