WHEREAS, heretofore and on the 2nd day of September, 1958, pursuant to resolution duly adopted by this Council on the 20th day of August, 1958, the City entered into a contract with The Callanan Road Improvement Company of South Bethlehem, New York, for the resurfacing of portions of Washington and Columbia Streets in the City of Rensselaer, for the sum of Thirty Two Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety (\$32,990.00) Dollars, and,

WHEREAS, in the course of said work, while preparing to resurface Columbia Street and after same had been excavated and completely ripped up, it was discovered that the entire bed of the said street was caving in due to lack of proper or no foundation for the bed of said street, and

WHEREAS, this condition was not, nor could it be, discovered until excavation preparatory to resurfacing had been made, and could not have been reasonably foreseen in time to include such work in said contract or in time to advertise for bids therefor, and

WHEREAS, the said Columbia Street being a main artery for traffic travelling over Routes 9 and 20 and at the time of the discovery of the condition of the foundation of same the said Street was already torn up and closed off, and,

WHEREAS, it was found necessary by the City's Consulting Engineer to construct and lay a new bed for such street consisting of crushed stone foundation and concrete bed, and

WHEREAS, such unspecified and emergency work was not called for in original contract hereinbefore referred to but was performed and carried out by the Callanan Road Improvement Company without bid therefor at a cost of Thirty-Thousand Three Hundred Eighty Four (\$30,384.00) Dollars and which said sums remain unpaid,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Council do and it hereby does pursuant to Section 103 of the General Municipal Law, declare that in the circumstances set forth above, a public emergency arising out of an unforeseen condition affecting the life, health and safety of the people of the City of Rensselaer did exist and did require immediate action which could not await competitive bidding, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Council do and it hereby does ratify, approve and confirm all acts of the Consulting Engineer and the Callanan Road Improvement Company in connection with the performance of said unspecified and emergency work arising out of the resurfacing of Columbia Street aforesaid,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the additional cost of said work in the amount of \$30,384.00 be and the same is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.


NOTICE OF RESUMPTION

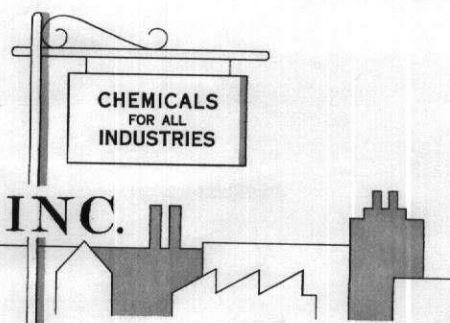





Gentlemen:

I hereby respectfully request of your commission that a directive or order be made to the City of Rensselaer Water Department for a water service connection to service the contemplated development of lands on the Westerly side of Columbia Turnpike (U.S. Routes 9 & 20), Town of East Greenbush, Rensselaer County, New York. I, with my mother and brother above named, are the owners of the lands concerned.

The lands proposed to be developed are immediately adjacent to a 12" water supply main running along the same side of the said highway. I believe this application comes within the purview of an Order of your Commission dated September 9, 1952 entitled, "In the Matter of Water Supply Application #2267".

It is proposed that a shopping center be developed on a 10 acre plot of land and it is anticipated by the architect, Mr. Gordon P. Schopfer, Syracuse, New York, that at least 1,250,000 gallons of water will be needed once the center is in full operation. Construction is contemplated within the next month.

Some precedent has been established for the granting of the water supply connection herein requested in that there does presently exist on the site a 1" water supply tap that has been used for a number of years to supply water to a miniature golf range and driving range that has, up until now occupied the premises to be developed into a shopping center. Essentially it is requested that the water supply connection be enlarged. The architect feels that an 8" connection be made for proper service.

It is proposed by the developer that all costs of installation and piping be paid for by it, that the City have no burden of expense other than the tap to be made and the meters to be installed.

An application was made in the summer of 1959 to the City of Rensselaer for such water service connection. No positive response was made by the City or any representative of the City. Mr. James Millea, corporation counsel for the City, advised me that negotiations were undertaken to work out a solution of the water problem existing between the City of Rensselaer and the Town of East Greenbush. You will recall that a Hearing was had at the City Hall in Rensselaer in the summer of 1959 and the same was adjourned pending further negotiations between the City and the Town.

February 17, 1960

On January 25, 1960, I again requested of the City of Rensselaer a water service connection. On February 4, 1960, I received a letter from the Rensselaer City Clerk advising that they could not grant the water service connection requested for the reason, "We find due to small lines to pumping station we will be unable to furnish water at this time!"

The development proposed in East Greenbush I feel is desirable from all angles, is a public betterment and a public necessity in a sense. The progress of the community should not be stalled or delayed because of negotiations or differences existing between one municipality and another. The source of water, although questionable in quality, is unlimited. A mere pumping deficiency should not be used as a valid argument for refusing water connections.

The City of Rensselaer is under a directive to supply water in the Town of East Greenbush to users requesting the service along existing mains. There have been many water service connections granted by the City to other users. A very large number of household users and a large number of commercial users, even very recent commercial users, have been granted connections. Why the discrimination? Right is right!

The volume that we request should not 'break the camel's back'. Water volume presently being used by existing commercial enterprises in the Town of East Greenbush is being excessively wasted. The present waste would more than supply and the needs of our proposed development. Several restaurants, motels and other establishments are using Rensselaer water for cooling refrigerators and for air-conditioning cooling. Waste water flows from these establishments in a veritable creek.

The need for this water service connection becomes more urgent as the time draws near for construction to commence. I, therefore, request the Commission's early attention to our need.

I enclose copies of my letter to the City of Rensselaer and their reply.
