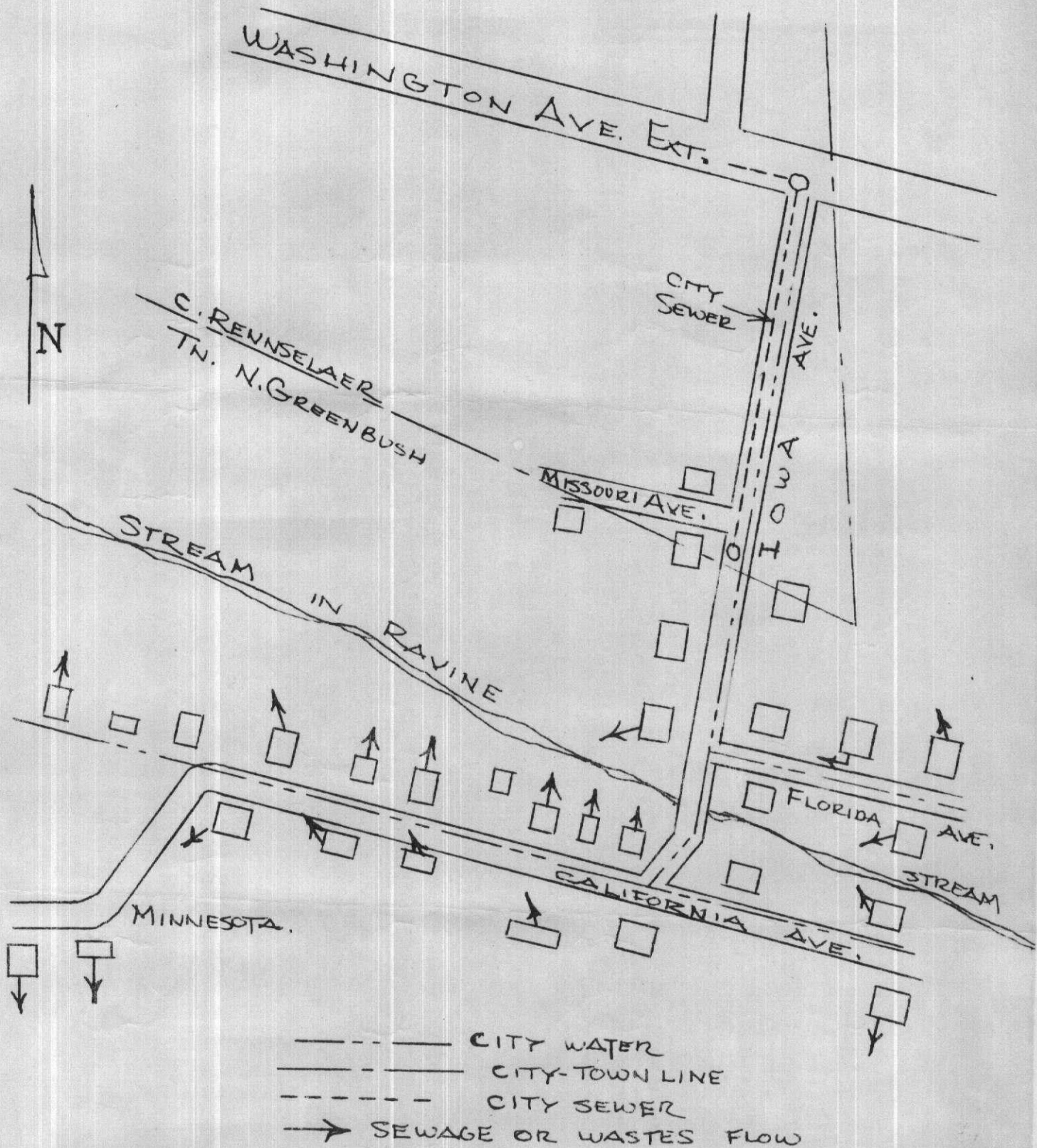

Dear Supervisor Vail:

As requested by you we have made a sanitary survey of the Van Allen Park area. The chief object of the survey was to determine specific details in regard to the sewage and wastes problems which exist in the area. Individual interviews of 19 home owners in the area were made by Messrs. Martone and Mc Cullough, sanitary inspectors with this department.

Findings:

- 1) There are a total of 27 homes in the area surveyed (see attached sketch)
- 2) Population of the area is 109 persons with an average of 4 persons per household.
- 3) 25 of the 27 homes in the area are served by the City of Rensselaer Public Water Supply.
- 4) 25 of the 27 homes in the area receive garbage collection serviced from the City of Rensselaer.
- 5) The City of Rensselaer sewerage system terminates at the City boundary line immediately adjacent to the Van Allen Park area.
- 6) Sewage overflows existed at 19 (or 70%) of the 27 homes.
- 7) Fifteen of the 19 householders interviewed desired public sewerage facilities. Of the remaining 4 householders, three reserved decision pending cost estimates and one householder was opposed to public facilities.

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- 8) Existing state and federal assistance plans are such that sewage treatment plant costs can be reduced.

Correction Alternatives:

1) Since a public sewer is now available at the intersection of Iowa and Missouri Avenues, disposal to a public sewerage system is worthy of consideration. The use of this sewer would require the installation of sewers on California, Iowa and Florida Avenues. These sewers would drain to the lowest convenient point at which a pumping station could be located. This station would boost the sewage and wastes through a force main to the existing sewer on Iowa Avenue.

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This proposal requires the formation of a town sewer district. Since the existing sewer is located within the City of Rensselaer. The town sewer district would contract with the City of Rensselaer for the use of the sewerage system just as the Wynantskill Sewer District contracts with the City of Troy. Sewers, pump and force main would cost approximately \$15,000 installed. If amortized over a 30-year period the annual cost to pay off this investment would be \$29 per home, plus operation and maintenance costs.

2) The area might also be served by a small central sewage treatment plant. Such a facility would treat sewage and wastes delivered to the plant and then discharge the treated wastes to a stream. As in the case of the pumping station alternative, a town sewer district would be formed. All costs would be paid by the property owners within the district. In addition to the repayment of the original investment, operating and maintenance costs would have to be considered. It is estimated that the cost of the sewers, manholes, treatment plant, equipment and outfall sewer would be about \$19,000. If amortized over a 30 year period the annual cost per home would be \$33, plus the pro rated cost of operation and maintenance.

3) Small lot size, the low elevation of existing sewer lines and poor soil conditions make it impossible to consider individual correction of the health hazards which exist. It is therefore recommended no consideration be given to individual correction.

Conclusion:

The area surveyed is degraded by numerous sewage and wastes discharges. The health hazard and nuisance condition cannot be corrected by individual construction. The most economical and practical method of correction is by the installation of sewers, pumping station and force main to connect to an existing sewer at Iowa and Missouri Avenues. If negotiations with the City of Rensselaer indicate that an agreement can be reached for the use of the existing sewer the Town can apply for state or federal monies to finance sewerage planning. If use of city sewers is not possible, funds could be secured for sewerage planning and treatment.
