Gentlemen:

On Tuesday, February 2nd, Mr. Spottke, a representative of the National Bureau of Casualty and Surety Underwriters of New York City, met with Alderman Welsh and a citizens group consisting of Clarence DeMyer, William J. Flynn, Raymond Delaney, James E. Scully, together with myself in the city Hall in relation to a discussion for the purpose of securing relief from the high automobile liability rates.

After a two hour conference, which we deemed very satisfactory, Mr. Spottke has agreed to submit to the committee who fix rates, the situation of Rensselaer, as our contention was that we should be terminated from the so-called Troy Area because of the high accident rate in that area to which the City of Rensselaer contributes but a very small percentage.

We hope within a very short time to have a favorable report to submit to your body.

Gentlemen:

On Saturday morning last, January 31, the following Alderman, Mr. McGowan, Mr. Welsh, Mr. Finn, Mr. Pratt and myself conferred with Mr. Persons, General Manager of the United Traction Company in relation to giving bus service to the people of the so-called "Hollow" district comprising Partition Street, Fifth Sixth, Lawrence, Willow and Wilson Streets.

Also at the conference was brought up the question of extending the buses in the lower section of the City so that people of Columbia and South Streets would get some service.

In addition there was some discussion about our now having the buses, which terminate now at Tenth Street, go right through to the City Line.

We were favorably received by Mr. Persons, but unfortunately the company is now planning a reorganization, and these plans have not yet been consummated. Nothing along the lines of extension could be hoped for. However he has promised to have an immediate survey made and, when the plans of reorganization are completed, if the situation is feasible to the company, they have promised that they will cooperate with us in every way possible.

A committee led by Mayor Charles G. Maloy, and including James S. Hillea, Corporation Counsel, Albert J. Geneibly, City Treasurer with William J. Lyons, Chairman of Rensselaer Democratic Committee, together with President of Common Council Thomas S. H. Clark, and Majority Leader Vincent Finn, and Aldermen James McGowan, Joseph Distell, Everett Clarke, reported to the Common Council that they had met with Senator Hastings and Assemblyman Whitney and Senator Gray at the Capitol on Monday evening, January 26th, for the purpose of discussing with them the terms and possibility of passage of an Act of the Legislature, aiding the Albany-Rensselaer Port District Commission. Such Act would provide that the State furnish \$100,000.00 to take care of the deficit under which the Port has been operating since the outbreak of the war in 1939. Mr. Maloy stated that he received the assurances of Senators Hastings and Gray and of Assemblyman that they would do everything that they could to secure passage of the Act.

ORDINANCE NO. _____ FOR 1942

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OR CONTRACTS FOR THE LEASING AND INSTALLATION OF PARKING METERS FOR A TRIAL PERIOD OF SIX MONTHS.

From

The City of Rensselaer, in Common Council convened, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby vested with power and authority to enter into a contract for a six (6) months' trial period after approval of the terms and conditions thereof by the Corporation Counsel for the leasing and installation of parking meters by the DUAL PARKING METER COMPANY of Oklahoma City in the State of Oklahoma, the payment for such meters and/or installation to be provided for solely from the receipts, funds and revenues obtained from the operation of said parking meters without in any manner whatsoever obligating the City of Rensselaer to pay for the same from any other source.

SECTION 2. The Mayor is further authorized and empowered to enter into a contract after the approval of the terms and conditions thereof by the Corporation Counsel for such protection and maintenance of said parking meters as may be necessary to maintain the same in good operating condition, and to pay for such parts, protection and maintenance exclusively from the receipts, funds and revenues received from the operation of said parking meters.

SECTION 3. The City of Rensselaer shall receive from the operation of said parking meters during the trial period at least twenty-five per cent (25%) of the revenue from the said meters.


SECTION 4. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to provide for the installation, operation, maintenance, super-

vision, regulation and use of said parking meters in the established parking meter zones, and he shall, during the trial period, allocate such various designs or types of meter to the area within said parking meter zone as he shall deem in the public interest.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.



BY ALDERMAN FINN:

WHEREAS, heretofore and on the 20th day of February, 1941, pursuant to Section Four of Chapter 22 of the Laws of 1941, the City of Rensselaer, through its Mayor, did create and establish a Local Defense Council for the said City, and

WHEREAS, the said Local Defense Council has certified to the Common Council that funds are immediately required to defray the expenses of said Defense Council to enable it to carry out its activities during the balance of the fiscal year ending July 1st, 1942 and

WHEREAS, Section Four of Chapter 22 of the Laws of 1941 as amended by Section Four B of Chapter 210 of the Laws of 1941 authorized the several cities whose annual budgets for the immediate fiscal year are required by law to be adopted prior to July 1st, to issue certificates of indebtedness which said certificates may be made payable from the taxes to be assessed and levied for the fiscal year succeeding the immediate fiscal year, to wit, the fiscal year 1942-1943, and

WHEREAS, the annual budget for the City of Rensselaer is required by its Charter to be adopted on or before the first day of July in each year, and

WHEREAS, the period of probable usefulness of the said certificates of indebtedness to be paid out of taxes levied during the said fiscal year succeeding the immediate fiscal year has been determined to be eighteen months,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars be and it hereby is appropriated for use by the said Defense Council in defraying its expenses in the carrying out of its activities, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the said sum of One Thousand (\$1,000) Dollars be raised by the issuance and sale of a certificate of indebtedness, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Treasurer be and he hereby

is authorized and directed to negotiate a certificate of indebtedness in the said sum of One Thousand (\$1,000) Dollars dated the 14 day of Feb, 1942 or such later date as said City Treasurer may determine, bearing interest at a rate of not to exceed 2 1/2% per annum, both principal and interest to be payable the 14 day of Aug 1942, and that said certificate shall be issued in registered form and shall be subject to earlier call for payment of the option of the City upon ten (10) days notice in writing to the registered holder; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the said certificate of indebtedness shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the Rensselaer County Bank and Trust Company, Rensselaer, New York, with New York Exchange and shall be signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk, and sealed with the corporate seal of the City and otherwise shall be in such form and contain such recitals as the officer executing the same shall determine; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the said certificate of indebtedness shall be sold by the City Treasurer at private sale for not less than par at the best rate of interest obtainable not exceeding the rate above specified and the proceeds of the sale thereof shall be applied solely to the purpose aforesaid and that said certificate of indebtedness shall be paid from the taxes to be assessed and levied for the fiscal year succeeding the immediate fiscal year, to wit, the fiscal year 1942-1943.

GOOD SKIN CARE... I have a large hard pimple. Sometimes these do not come to a head, but stay like a little lump under the skin for a week or more. How can I prevent these annoying blemishes, and what should I do when a pimple appears?—Ruth." Try to avoid pressing the pimples once they form. Put on a dot of medicated salve, acne ointment or zinc oxide. This may relieve the congestion sufficiently so it will go to a head. If the latter happens, sponge with alcohol then open with a sterilized needle. Extract the pus by taking up a large portion of flesh between the thumb and finger and rolling and pressing gently. Touch the spot again with alcohol-soaked cotton. Be sure to burn the cotton or tissue on which you take the pus. Have a physical check-up by your doctor to see if a change of diet or more vitamins and minerals will build up resistance against the infection causing the blemishes. Be fussy about your skin. Washing at least three times a day with warm soapsuds will keep the skin germ-free and free from excessive oil accumulations on which bacteria thrive. Use a slightly drying powder lotion as a make-up base.
