Mr Fear of the United States Geological Survey
appeared before the board of Aldermen and
Spoke in regard to the flood conditions of Jackson
ding Creek. He stated he had made a survey
of the Creek and showed a number of Pictures
he had taken pointing out bad conditions
along the Creek. He stated that in order to make
any report as to what should be done, that the
first thing was to have a gauge installed along
the Creek for a year or longer showing the
amount of water that would flow down the creek
in that time then we would have information
as to about how large a dam would be necessary

or some other improvement to take care of the flood
conditions that occur. He stated that the Federal
Government would like the expense of determining the
flow 50-50 - a committee has the proposition under
consideration.

IN THE MATTER

OF

THE APPLICATION OF THE ALBANY PORT DISTRICT COMMISSION PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 3, OF ARTICLE 8, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, AND SECTION 6-A OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, TO CONTRACT AN INDEBTEDNESS.

The Petition of the Albany Port District Commission respectfully shows:

FIRST: That your Petitioner is a corporate district organized and existing pursuant to Chapter 192 of the Laws of 1925, of the State of New York, and Acts amendatory thereof.

SECOND: Your Petitioner desires the consents of the cities of Albany and Rensselaer, respectively, to the contracting of an indebtedness by it, pursuant to the provisions of Article 8, Section 3 of the Constitution of the State of New York, and Section 6-A of the General Municipal Law.

THIRD: (a) The amount of the outstanding indebtedness of said corporate district is the sum of six million, four hundred and seventy-five thousand (\$6,475,000.00) dollars, and the purpose for which the foregoing indebtedness was contracted was for the construction, development, maintenance and operation of the Albany Port District, including the cost of necessary facilities and the general development of the Port. The manner in which such indebtedness will be paid is from revenues collected by said Commission from rentals and use of the facilities of the said Port, and from the proceeds of taxes caused by the Commission to be levied and collected by the cities of Albany and Rensselaer upon the real estate located within such respective municipalities and subject to the imposition of such taxes, all pursuant to and in the manner provided by Chapter 192 of the Laws of 1925, as amended, which said statute created the Albany Port District and the Albany Port District Commission.

(b) The amount of outstanding indebtedness of the corporate

district which is already included in ascertaining the power of the municipalities in which it is situated to contract indebtedness is the sum of one hundred and eighty-two thousand (\$182,000.00) dollars.

(c) The amount of the indebtedness proposed to be contracted by such corporate district is the sum of one hundred and eight thousand, six hundred and ninety-one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$108,691.25).

The purpose for which the indebtedness will be contracted is to pay interest on bonded indebtedness in the sum of forty-three thousand, six hundred ninety-one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$43,691.25) which becomes due and payable on the 1st day of August, 1944, and to pay the principal of bonds maturing in the sum of sixty-five thousand (\$65,000.00) dollars on the 1st day of August, 1944, for all of which the Petitioner heretofore obligated itself by the sale of bonds as aforesaid, and the manner in which the said sum of one hundred and eight thousand, six hundred ninety-one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$108,691.25) will be contracted for will be by said Petitioner borrowing on certificates of indebtedness to be issued by it to a bank in the City of Albany, New York, and obtaining the said sum of one hundred and eight thousand, six hundred ninety-one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$108,691.25) as a loan thereon.

The proportionate amount of such indebtedness proposed to be contracted to be allocated to the City of Albany is one hundred one thousand, five hundred ninety-three dollars and seventy-one cents (\$101,593.71).

The proportionate amount of such indebtedness to be allocated to the City of Rensselaer is seven thousand ninety-seven dollars and sixty-four cents (\$7,097.64).

That such proportionate amount is arrived at pursuant to the procedure set forth in Section 6-B of the General Municipal Law, as follows:

1. The assessed valuation of the taxable real property

located within the City of Albany ascertained from the last completed assessment roll is two hundred forty million, one hundred sixty thousand, one hundred thirty-nine (\$240,160,139.00) dollars.

1-a The assessed valuation of the taxable real property located within the City of Rensselaer ascertained from the last completed assessment roll is fifteen million, nine hundred forty-three thousand, fifty-nine (\$15,943,059.00) dollars.

2. The last available ratio of the assessed valuation to the true valuation for the City of Albany as established by the State Tax Commission is 93% as appears from the attached certificate of Herbert F. O'Malley, Secretary, given under his hand and seal of the Department of Taxation and Finance, and the State Tax Commission June 21, 1944.

2-a The last available ratio of the assessed valuation to the true valuation for the City of Rensselaer as established by the State Tax Commission is 88% as appears from the attached certificate of Herbert F. O'Malley, Secretary, given under his hand and the seal of the Department of Taxation and Finance, and the State Tax Commission on June 21, 1944.

3. The full valuation of the taxable real property within the corporate district situated in the City of Albany is the sum of two hundred fifty-nine million, three hundred eleven thousand nine hundred and sixty-six (\$259,311,966.00) dollars, which full valuation is determined by dividing the assessed valuation of such real property as above set forth by the ratio fixed for the City of Albany by the State Tax Commission.

3-a The full valuation of the taxable real property within the corporate district situated in the City of Rensselaer is the sum of eighteen million, one hundred seventeen thousand, one hundred and twelve (\$18,117,112) dollars, which full valuation is determined by dividing the assessed valuation of such real property as above set forth by the rate fixed for the City of Rensselaer by the State Tax Commission.

4. The proportionate amount of such indebtedness allocated to the City of Albany was ascertained by multiplying the amount of such indebtedness, to wit, one hundred eight thousand six hundred ninety-one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$108,691.25) by the percentage or ratio of full value of the taxable real property within the corporate district situated in the City of Albany, to wit, two hundred fifty-nine million, three hundred eleven thousand, nine hundred and sixty-six (\$259,311,966.00) dollars bears to the total full value of the taxable real property within the entire corporate district, to wit, two hundred seventy-seven million, four hundred twenty-nine thousand and seventy-eight (\$277,429,078.00) dollars.

The percentage or ratio thus arrived at for the City of Albany is .9347.

4-a The proportionate amount of such indebtedness allocated to the City of Rensselaer was ascertained by multiplying the amount of such indebtedness, to wit, one hundred eight thousand, six hundred ninety-one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$108,691.25) by the percentage or ratio of full value of the taxable real property within the corporate district situated in the City of Rensselaer, to wit: eighteen million, one hundred seventeen thousand, one hundred twelve (\$18,117,112.00) dollars, bears to the total full value of the taxable real property within the entire corporate district, to wit: two hundred seventy-seven million, four hundred twenty-nine thousand, and seventy-eight (\$277,429,078.00) dollars.

The percentage or ratio thus arrived at for the City of Rensselaer is .0653.

(b) The Petitioner further states that the manner in which funds will be provided for the payment of the proposed indebtedness is from moneys provided wholly or partly by taxes to be levied and collected in the 1944-1945 fiscal year of the Commission on the real property within the city of Albany and the City of Rensselaer, and from revenues obtained from the use of the facilities of the Commission.

(c) A description of the real property within the cities of



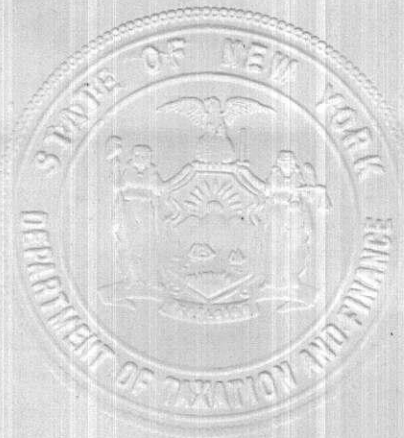

WHEREAS, there has been presented to the Common Council at its regular meeting held July 5th, 1944, a petition of the Albany Port District Commission, requesting the consent of the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer, for the contracting of an indebtedness in the sum of One hundred eight thousand, six hundred ninety-one and twenty-five hundredths (\$108,691.25) dollars, the proportionate amount of which indebtedness which would be allocated to the City of Rensselaer being the sum of Seven thousand, ninety-seven and sixty-four hundredths (\$7,097.64) dollars, to be evidenced by certificates of indebtedness and to be repaid from the proceeds of taxes heretofore caused by the said Albany Port District Commission to be levied and collected by the cities of Albany and Rensselaer; and

WHEREAS, there has been presented at the same time a certificate of the City Clerk setting forth the information required by Section 6-A of the General Municipal Law; and

WHEREAS, a notice that a public hearing will be held at the Council Chambers on July 19, 1944 at eight o'clock P.M., E.W.T. was published in the official newspaper, the Rensselaer County Review, a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Rensselaer, on the 8th day of July, 1944; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council met at the Council Chambers on the 19th day of July, 1944, for the purpose of a hearing and to consider such petition; and

WHEREAS, no one appeared in opposition thereto;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Rensselaer hereby gives its consent to the contracting of an indebtedness by the Albany Port District Commission in the sum of One hundred eight thousand, six hundred ninety-one and twenty-five hundredths (\$108,691.25) dollars, the proportionate amount of which indebtedness which would be allocated to the City of Rensselaer being Seven thousand, ninety-seven and sixty-four hundredths (\$7,097.64) dollars, to be evidenced by certificates of indebtedness and to be repaid from the proceeds of taxes heretofore caused by the said Albany Port District Commission to be levied and collected by the cities of Albany and Rensselaer.
