ORDINANCE NO. 4 FOR 1946

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC AND THE USE AND OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS IN THE CITY OF RENSSELAER; PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION AND CONTROL OF TRAFFIC AND PRESCRIBING RULES AND REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE MOVEMENT OF TRAFFIC IN AND THROUGH THE CITY OF RENSSELAER; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND REPEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HEREWITH.

THE CITY OF RENSSELAER, in Common Council convened, does ordain
as follows:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. The following terms when used in ordinance this/section, unless otherwise expressly stated, or unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires, shall be deemed to mean and include:

(a.) "Public Highway" shall include any highway, road, street, avenue, alley, public place, public driveway or any other public way.

(b.) "Street" or "Roadway" shall include that part of the public highway intended for vehicular travel and "Sidewalk" shall mean that portion of the public highway outside of the street or roadway, used or set aside for the use of pedestrians.

(c.) "Curb" shall include the boundaries of the roadway, whether marked by curb stone or not so marked.

(d.) "Crossing" or "Crosswalk" shall include that portion of a public highway clearly indicated for pedestrians crossing by lines or other markings and shall include the extension of the sidewalk space across intersecting streets whether marked or not so marked.

(e.) "Intersection" shall include the area bounded by the side lines, real or projected, of two or more public highways that meet or cross each other.

(f.) "Vehicle" shall include any device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway, except a baby carriage and devices used exclusively on stationary rails or tracks.

(g.) "Motor Vehicle" shall include all vehicles propelled by any power other than muscular power, except motor cycles, traction engines, road rollers, fire and police vehicles, tractors used exclusively for agricultural purposes, tractor cranes, power shovels, road building machines, snow plows, road sweepers, sand spreaders, well drillers, electric trucks with small wheels used in factories, warehouses and railroad stations and operated principally on private property and such vehicles as run only upon rails or tracks.

(h.) "Bicycle" shall include any vehicle consisting of an arrangement or combination of two wheels, one following the other, supported by a frame, propelled by the feet acting upon pedals.

(i.) "Motor Cycle" shall include all motor cycles. A motor cycle is a vehicle propelled by other than muscular power which is so designed that the operator steers the vehicle by turning the single front wheel of the vehicle by means of handle bars.

(j.) "Omnibus" shall include any motor vehicle or motor cycle held and used in the business of transporting passengers for hire.

(k.) "Horse" shall include all domestic animals used as draught animals or beasts of burden.

(l.) "Driver" shall include a person who propels or operates or who is in charge of a vehicle.

(m.) "Pedestrian" shall include all persons making use of public highways for foot passage.

(n.) "Chauffeur" shall mean any person who is employed for the principal purpose of operating a motor vehicle or who drives a motor vehicle while in use as a public or common carrier of persons or property.

(o.) "Operator" shall mean any person other than a chauffeur, who operates or drives a motor vehicle or motor cycle upon any public highway.

SECTION 2. POLICE DEPARTMENT AUTHORITY. It shall be the duty of the Police Department of the City of Rensselaer to en-

force the provisions of this ordinance strictly and impartially and said Police Department is hereby authorized, empowered and ordered to direct, control, restrict and regulate, and when necessary, temporarily to divert or exclude in the interest of public safety, health and convenience, the movement of pedestrians, vehicular and traffic of every kind in the streets, squares, parks, parkways, alleys, bridges and public places of the City of Rensselaer and pedestrians, drivers of vehicles and all other persons in the streets and public places of the City of Rensselaer must at all times comply with any direction by voice, whistle or signal of members of the Police Department as to stopping, starting, approaching or departing from any place, the method of taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading of freight.

SECTION 3. SPEED LIMITED.

(a.) Every person operating a motor vehicle or motor cycle upon the public highways and streets in the City of Rensselaer shall drive such vehicle in a careful and prudent manner and at a rate of speed so as not to endanger the property of another or the life or limb of any person having due regard, to the traffic surface, with^a the highway and any other existing restrictions and conditions and at a rate of speed that will permit such person to bring the vehicle to a stop without injury to another or his property.

(b.) No person shall operate any vehicle on any public street or highway in the City of Rensselaer at a rate of speed in excess of twenty miles an hour.

(c.) A rate of speed by a motor vehicle or motor cycle in excess of twenty miles an hour for a distance of one-fourth of a mile shall be presumpt^{VE}~~ive~~ evidence of driving at a rate of speed which is not careful and prudent.

SECTION 4. RIGHT OF WAY. When in the performance of duty the following vehicles shall have the right of way: United States Mail, Police, Fire, Fire Patrol, Bureau of Streets, Emergency

Repair of the City and public service corporations, Ambulances, the Military and vehicles equipped with a gong or siren whistle operated by a chief or assistant chief of a Fire Department provided that such gong or siren whistle is being sounded.

SECTION 5. EQUIPMENT.

(a.) Mufflers. Every motor vehicle shall have a suitable muffler or device to prevent unnecessary noise from exhaust gases and the use of so called "cut outs" is prohibited.

(b.) Brakes. Every motor vehicle operated or driven on the streets of the City of Rensselaer shall be provided with adequate brakes in good working order and sufficient to control such vehicle at all times when the same is in use.

SECTION 6. PROHIBITIONS.

(a.) Fire Hydrants. No vehicle of any description shall be parked, stopped or left standing within ten feet of a fire hydrant.

(b.) Barriers. No person shall drive any vehicle over or across any newly made pavement in any public street, across or around which pavement there is a barrier, or at, over or near which there is a person or sign warning persons not to drive over or across such pavement, or a sign that the street is closed.

(c.) Bicycles. No person riding a bicycle in the public streets of the City of Rensselaer shall hang on to a bus, automobile, motorcycle or any other vehicle of any other nature.

SECTION 7. OBSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALK. No person shall place or leave any bicycle, tricycle, motorcycle, motor vehicle or other vehicle upon any sidewalk in such manner as to obstruct traffic on or across the same, nor shall any bicycle, tricycle, motorcycle, motor vehicle or other vehicle be left upon any street between the curbs thereof so as to obstruct traffic. No person shall drive any vehicle upon any sidewalk of the City of Rensselaer.

SECTION 8. SAFETY ZONES. Where zones are provided and designated in a visible and suitable manner, it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle within the safety zone when the same is occupied, and in no case when it is practicable to proceed through the adjacent traffic lane.

SECTION 9. TOWING OF VEHICLES THROUGH THE STREETS. In towing vehicles through the streets of the City of Rensselaer two men shall be required, one operating the forward machine, one steering the rear machine. The distance between the machines shall be not more than fifteen feet.

SECTION 10. PENALTIES. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 11. REPEAL. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in so far as same may be in conflict with or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. This ordinance shall be deemed to be in addition and supplementary to and not in conflict with nor a repeal of prior or existing ordinances of the City of Rensselaer but shall be an additional provision for the regulation of traffic.

SECTION 13. If any section, part of section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining provisions hereof shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.

~~SECTION 14. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed~~

SECTION 14. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its approval by the Mayor of the City of Rensselaer and upon completion of publication of same for two successive weeks in the official newspaper of the City of Rensselaer, pursuant to Section 83 of the Rensselaer City Charter.
