I have examined the old culvert over the Quackenderry Creek on Broadway about 450 feet north of Herrick St. and I find the southerly side of the easterly half in very bad condition. There is a portion of this where the concrete base of the granite block pavement is entirely exposed.

I recommend to you and your honorable Common Council that this matter receive early consideration and that the necessary money be appropriated to pruchase the materials for this work. I have submitted this to the Work Relief Bureau as a project and the local Commission are there to copperate and it will undoubtedly receive the endorsement of the Relief Commission in New York City.

The estimated cost of the materials to do this work will be \$3,500.00.

Resolved, that the Rensselaer County Bank of the City of Rensselaer, N.Y. and its successors are hereby designatev as the depository for the purpose of depositing funds of the City of Rensselaer; and ve it further

Resolved, that the said Bank is to pay interest on daliy balances at current rates, to be credited at the end of each month: and beit further

Resolved, that the said Rensselaer County Bank and its successors be and they are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to honor checks drawin by the City of Rensselaer on the said Rensselaer County Bank or its successors, and signed by the Mayor and City Treasurer, and with out the countersignature of the City Clerk; and be it further

Resolved, that the said Rensselaer County Bank or its successor, shall execute and file with the City Treasurer a bond to the City of Rensselaer in a sum equivalent to and not less than one hundred per cent of the deposits at all times and in such form and with such surety or sureties as may be approved by the Mayor for the safe keeping and prompt payment of such moneys on legal

legal demand therefor with interest at the rate herein specified or in lieu of such surety deposit bond in whole or in part, deposit with the City Treasurer by placing the same in a safe deposit box in the Rensselaer County Bank, subject to the joint control of the Rensselaer County Bank or its successors and the City of Rensselaer, and to be opened only in the presence of the Mayor, City Treasurer and Corporation Counsel or any two of them, and the President of the Rensselaer County Bank or his representative, outstanding unmatured certificates of indebtedness or bonds issued by the City of Rensselaer, outstanding unmatured bonds of the State of New York or of the government of the United States or other municipal bonds or bonds known as "Grade A" bonds and such other bonds or obligations for the payment of money as may be agreed upon by the Mayor, Corporation Counsel and City Treasurer or a majority of them and the President of the Rensselaer County Bank or his representative, and such securities so deposited may be withdrawn or added to from time to time by the said Rensselaer County Bank or its successors and in the manner aforesaid, and the City Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to make such changes as herein provided so that said surety bond in whole or in part and such securities so deposited shall equal at all times such deposits and interest; and it is further

For the prompt payment hereof both principal and interest, as the same become due, the full faith, credit and resources of said City are irrevocably prior to Jan. 1, 1933 by the City of Rensselaer upon its having funds properly applicable to the payment thereof.

It is hereby certified and recited that each and every act, condition and thing required to be done, to have happened and to be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Certificate of Indebtedness has been done, has been performed and has happened in full and strict compliance with the Constitution and laws of the State of New York, and that this Certificate of Indebtedness together with all other obligations of said City does not exceed any Constitutional or Statutory limitation.
