Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer on the 18th day of October, 1927, duly authorized and provided for the issuance and delivery of a Special Certificate of Indebtedness in the sum of Thirty-Two Thousand Twenty-Five Dollars and Twelve Cents (\$32,025.12) with interest thereon at the rate of 4 3/4%, and payable Jan. 1st, 1932 for the payment of the following: for the laying of uniform concrete sidewalks and proper curbstones on the north and south sides of Partition Street from the westerly line of Broadway to the easterly line of Third St. ~~from~~, and on the east and west sides of Third Street from the northerly line of Partition St to the southerly line of Catherine St; on Bellview Terrace from Washington Ave. to Forbes Ave; on Forbes Ave. from Eighth St. to a point about 300 ft. east of Tenth Street, and on Tenth St. from Forbes Ave. about 800 ft. southerly therefrom; on the east side of East St. from the northerly line of Herrick St. to the southerly line of Wendell St; and on the west side of Elm St. from the northerly line of Herrick St. to the southerly line of Wendell St, and,

Whereas, said Common Council on the 7th day of Feb. 1928, duly authorized and provided for the issuance and delivery of a Special Certificate of Indebtedness in the Sum of Seventeen Thousand One Hundred Sixty-two Dollars and Forty-six Cents (\$17,162.46) with interest thereon at the rate of 4 3/4% and payable Jan. 1st, 1932, for the payment of the following; for the grading and re-surfacing of the roadway and construction of concrete curb and gutter and concrete sidewalks on the east and west sides of Second St. from Fowler Ave. northerly to Wash. Ave; for the paving of Broadway from the end of the granite block pavement at Catherine St. to the northely line of Washington Ave; for the laying and consturcting concrete sidewalks sixfeet wide on the east and west sides of Broadway from the northerly line of Catherine St. to the southerly line of Wash. Ave; for the laying and constructing of a sewer on South St. from Columbia St. to Aiken Ave; for the laying and constructing of a sewer on forbes Ave. from the end of the pavement pavement present sewer therein easterly to the City Line; and for the laying and constructing of a concrete sidewalk on the east side of Riverside Ave. from Aiken Ave. to Belmore Place, and,

Whereas, each of said Certificates has been duly issued and sold and provision duly made for the payment thereof on the 1st day of Jan., 1932, and there has remained unpaid since the 1st day of January, 1932 the sum of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars ((\$10,500.00) on the first of said Cerificates and on the second

of said Certificates the sum of Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$13,000.00) making a total of Twenty-three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$23,500.00) and,

Whereas, it is necessary that said Special Certificates of Indebtedness be renewed for a term of two (2) years, in the sum of Twenty-three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$23,500.00), to provide for the payment thereof as provided by law, now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the City Treasurer be and she hereby is authorized, empowered and directed to negotiate a Special Certificate of Indebtedness at private sale and without advertisement for the sum of Twenty-three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$23,500.00) payable January 1st., 1934 with interest thereon at a rate not exceeding 6% per annum on the principal sum from the 1st day of January, 1932, and be it further,

Resolved, that said Certificates of Indebtedness be in substantially the following form:

Know all men these presents;

That the City of Rensselaer, in the County of Rensselaer and State of New York for value received hereby promises to pay to the Rensselaer County Bank, its successors or assigns on the 1st. day of January, 1934, the principal sum of \$23,500.00, Twenty-three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars with interest thereon at rate of 6% per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of January and July in each year; the first interest date to be July 1st, 1932 and the interest to be computed from January 1st, 1932, with the privilege of paying Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or more on account of principal sum on any interest date.

Both principal and interest are payable at the office of the City Treasurer of the City of Rensselaer, and at the request of the holder, will be paid in New York Eschange. For the prompt payment hereof, both principal and interest, as the same become due, the full faith, credit and resources of the said City are irrevocably pledged. This Certificate may be redeemed and paid at any time prior to the 1st. day of January, 1934 by the City of Rensselaer upon it having funds properly applicable to the payment thereof.

It is hereby certified and recited that each and every act, condition and thing required to be done, to be performed and to have happened precedent to and in the issuance of this Certificate of Indebtedness has been done, has been performed and has happened in full and strict compliance with the constitution and laws of the State of New York, and that this Certificate of Indebtedness, together with all obligations of said City does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation..

In Witness whereof, the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer has caused the Corporate seal of the City of Rensselaer to be hereunto affixed and this Certificate of Indebtedness to be signed by its Mayor and City Clerk this day of February, 1932.
