COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR,
HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS AND CITY
OFFICERS.

The Clerk reported that the Mayor had approved of all resolutions passed at the last meeting of the Board.

Dear Sir:-

About April 1st, I recommended the Common Council appoint a committee to investigate and examine the condition of the concrete sidewalks on East Street, from Partition Street to Second Avenue. Mr. L. Orvis prepared such a resolution and it was passed by the Council at the meeting of April 5, 1932. Mr. Sewell Smith, President of the Council appointed the following Alderman on that committee: Fogarty, Green and Bonacker. As there have been quite a number of complaints and some of these walks are in bad condition, I trust some action will be taken at the meeting July 5th, 1932.

At this time I would like to report that I have submitted a plan to the State Department of Health and the same has been approved. This plan is for an overflow storm sewer in Washington Avenue, from Broadway to First Street. The sanitary sewer is inadequate to carry the increased flow during a storm period. It will eliminate what has been on two occasions a very bad condition at the residence of Mr. M. J. Lannon at the southwest corner of Washington Ave., and First Street. This plan is to divert the storm water from the manhole at the intersection of Washington Avenue and First Street to a receiving basin at the northwest corner; thence westerly to a (recently found) manhole; thence westerly and about three feet northerly and parallel to the northerly curblineline of Washington to a receiving basin at the northeast corner of Broadway and continuing westerly across Broadway to a receiving basin from which there is an 18 inch vitrified sewer to the storm water sewer in Forbes Avenue. The estimated cost of this project is \$650.00 and the amount out of this for the necessary materials would be about \$350.00. This should be done as soon as possible.

There is also need for repairs to the main entrance to Chemical No. 1 as the walls are showing cracks at different places. The cornice of the roof of this building should be painted as the paint is scaling off very rapidly.
