NOTICE OF PROPOSED LOCAL SEWER IMPROVEMENT along Wilson, Lawrence, Willow and Cottage Hill Streets, payable partially by local assessment,

TAKE NOTICE That the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer did heretofore and on the 16th day of May, 1934, duly declare its intention of laying and constructing sanitary sewers, together with the necessary Ys, appurtenances and manholes along Wilson Street from the present manhole at or near the intersection of Wilson and East Streets to the manhole at or near the intersection of Wilson and Lawrence Streets; thence along Lawrence Street to the manhole at or near the intersection of Lawrence and Wilson Streets; thence along Wilson Street to the manhole at or near the intersection of Wilson and Cottage Hill Streets; thence along Cottage Hill Street to the manhole at or near the intersection of Petition and Cottage Hill Streets, all in accordance with plan, profile and specifications number 45 now on file in the office of the City Engineer; and that in conjunction with said improvement there shall be installed the necessary appurtenances including Ys, service and house connection pipes and laterals opposite the several parcels of property abutting the said improvement as set forth and described on said map and in the resolutions pertaining to said improvement number 137, 138 and 139 as adopted by said Common Council on the aforesaid date.

That said Common Council did heretofore and at a regular meeting held the 16th day of May, 1934, duly determine a District of Assessment containing all of the property which in the judgment of the Common Council is likely to be benefited by said local improvement and which property should be served by laterals, service and house connection pipes, etc.

That at said time and place said Common Council did further provide that the cost of laying and constructing the aforesaid improvement consisting of Ys, laterals and appurtenances as determined and where necessary should be charged to and assessed against the owner or owners of the property abutting on, or affected by such local improvement.

That said Common Council did further direct the undersigned to give due notice thereof to the several owners of the properties determined to be within the District of Assessment, in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Rensselaer, in such cases made and provided; and to further give notice that any person interested may file his objection to said improvement with the undersigned not later than <sup>the next regular meeting of the Common Council to be held at</sup> 8:00 o'clock P. M. June 6, 1934, and that in the event no objection is filed with the undersigned, all persons will be deemed to have acquiesced in said local improvement.


Gentlemen:

With the awarding of the contract to eliminate the South Street Curve, the City Engineer reports to me there will be sufficient fill available to grade the large area between Cambridge Avenue, Rensselaer Avenue and Columbia Street for use as an athletic field and he has suggested to me that the grading and preparation of this field with the material derived from the South Street project should be a T.E.R.A. project.

On behalf of the Commission, I welcome a project of this kind as it involves very little material but labor classified as light labor which is very desirable for men who are unable to do the heavy labor work and a number of such men are on relief.

The estimated cost of this project under T.E.R.A. requirements is as follows: Labor of foremen, \$135; common labor, \$600; equipment and truck hire, \$96; materials, \$200; total, \$1031.00 of which three-fourths will be reimbursed to the City as expended. I, therefore, request that you authorize me to submit a project for this operation.




Gentlemen:

Upon the completion of the sewer and the new sidewalk on Elm Street, south of Herrick Street, it is apparent that some proper connection between the south end of this sidewalk and Fourth Avenue should be provided for the large number of children who come up this steep grade to attend school at St. John's Academy.

There is also an area of City property between Lawrence Street and Elm Street adjoining Fourth Avenue which could be properly graded and seeded with grass to improve the looks of the locality.

It is my opinion that a series of suitable stair cases and landings could be provided for the extension of the sidewalk to Fourth Avenue and the necessary grading of the City land area above described and owing to the fact that very much more labor could be provided than the cost of material, I request to be given authority to submit a project covering this work as soon as possible. The approximate estimate of the cost, in the absence of a definite survey, is as follows: Materials, \$100; labor, \$600; truck hire, \$50; total, \$750.00.




