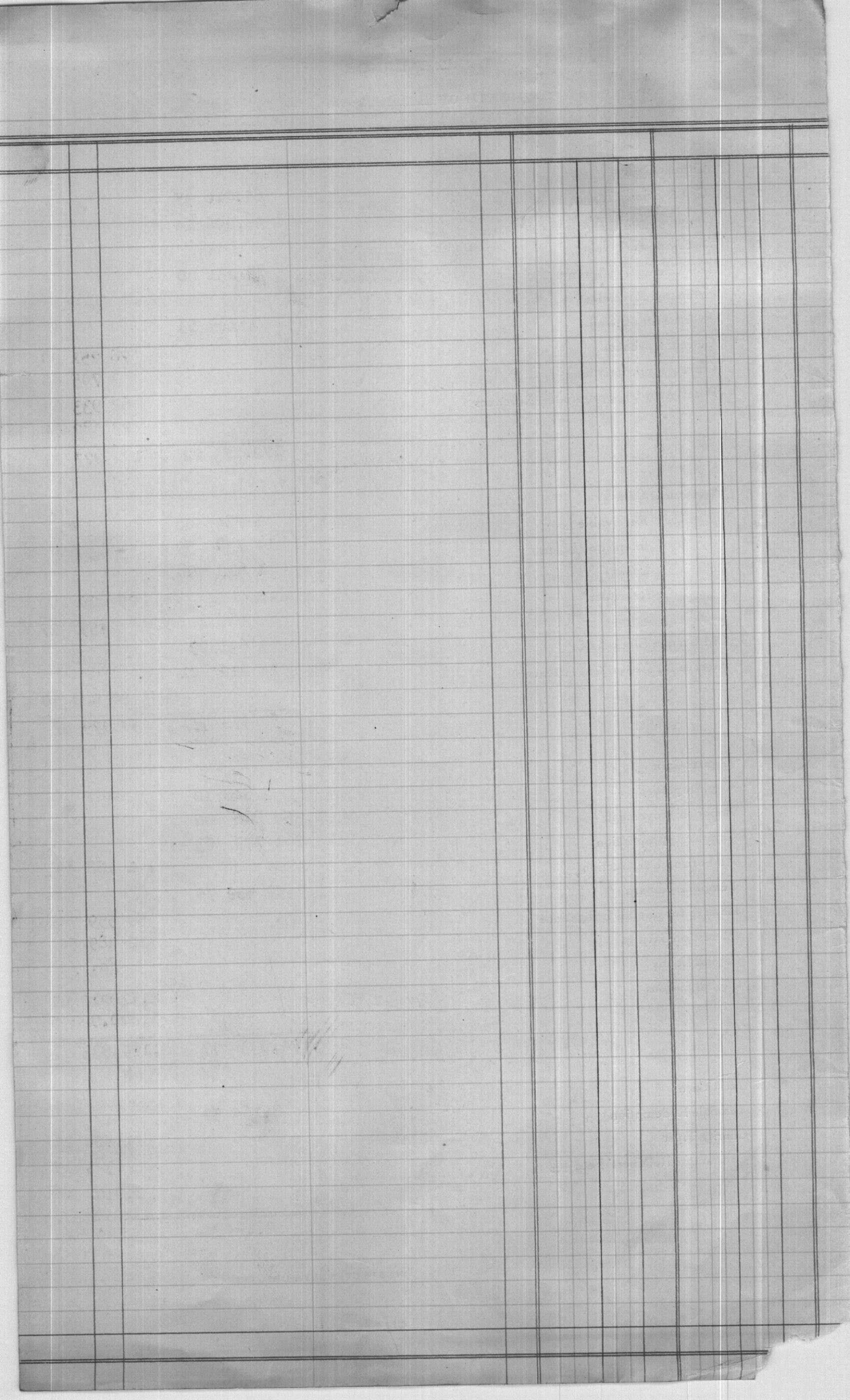



I am enclosing herewith a copy of a letter received from Barker and Wheeler, Engineers, 36 State Street, Albany, N.Y.. They made the survey, maps, designs and report for the proposed intercepting sewers and disposal plants in 1928.

At different times since the plans were submitted and approved Mr. Wheeler and myself have written to the Common Council recommending acquiring the lands required for disposal plants. In the report of 1928 on page 28, Projects No.3 and No.4 requires 8 acres for the south disposal site and 5 acres for the north site. One plant to be located at the South City line and one just north of the present water companys plant.

Awaiting your further consideration and instruction on this matter.

Dear Mr. Quinn:

The writer has recently been in contact with the officials both of the PWA and the WPA, and in view of the fact that the City of Rensselaer has had under consideration the construction of a sewage disposal plant, I am taking the liberty of suggesting that you bring this matter before the Mayor and Common Council with a view to finding out whether it would meet with the approval of the City Officials to have a Committee appointed to look into the matter of intercepting sewers and a sewage disposal plant, since it might be to the advantage of the City to undertake certain parts or all of this work with the aid of the Federal Government.

One of the first steps to be taken would be the acquisition of a sewage disposal site. After acquiring the land, work could be started on the intercepting sewers and it is my understanding that if this work is undertaken, a section at a time, it will be possible to carry it out under the Works Progress Administration with the Government furnishing all labor and part of the material.

If it is decided to appoint such a Committee, the writer will be glad to go over the situation with the Mayor or the Committee without any obligation on the part of the City.






