

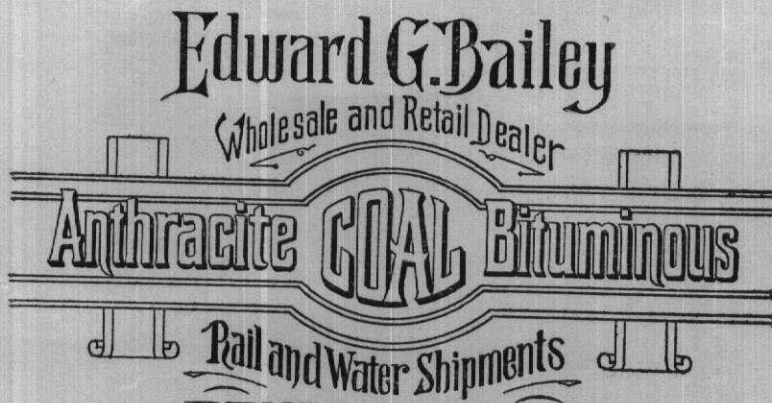

Dear Mr. Kaufman:

This will serve to confirm the decision reached in our meeting of this date.

The T.E.R.A. is not, in any sense, accountable for or responsible for control of funds which are raised locally. Consequently, if the Common Council has, by resolution, diverted \$100.00 from funds previously raised by a bond issue through a previous resolution for relief purposes and subsequently sees fit to use \$100.00 for another purpose, this would be a matter for local decision.

It is to be understood, however, that the expenditure of \$100.00 for the repair of the sidewalk in question, which was necessitated by damage during a T.E.R.A. project which is, at the present date, completed, is not to be considered a T.E.R.A. reimbursable expenditure.

It would be satisfactory and advisable, however, to draw men from relief rolls to do this job, in which case, their earnings would be recorded on a non-relief, non-reimbursable payroll and would appear on relief record cards as an income offsetting the budget deficiency.
