Gentlemen:

The City of Rensselaer for a number of years past has complained to the Rensselaer County Equalization Commission that the rates demanded by that commission were not fair to the City. We have been repeatedly and unfairly penalized for alleged underassessment of property as compared with the City of Troy and the rural districts.

A preliminary study of this matter convinced the Tax Commissioner and myself that Rensselaer was entitled to the benefit of a very much higher rate.

In 1934 and again in 1935 your Common Council authorized and requested me to take an appeal from such equalization rates to the State Tax Commission. These appeals were taken and are now pending.


Some time ago your Council appropriated the sum of \$500.00 to enable me to make a more complete preliminary inquiry and examination into the matter. Of this amount, I believe less than \$200.00 was expended. As the result of the data which was obtained, we did succeed in having the equalization commission recognize our position by giving Rensselaer the benefit of five points on the 1935 assessment. I understand that this change amounted to a savings of something over \$5,000.00 in taxes this year alone to the tax payers of the City of Rensselaer with respect to Rensselaer's share of the State and County taxes. I further understand that the City obtained a greater percentage of state moneys as the result of such change.

The Board of Review has refused to recommend any further adjustment of our appeals and the County has likewise failed to take any action to adjust the matter. I am satisfied that Rensselaer never obtained a more equitable rate without the carrying out of an appeal. As I have indicated, the matter is now pending before the State Tax Commission and preliminary hearings have been held. We have reached the point where the parcels to be considered by the commission have been tentatively agreed upon as to number, such number being approximately 1600 parcels. It is my understanding that the equalization commission has publicly declared that it will cost the county about \$20,000.00 to defend this action. I feel that I will be able to secure the necessary appraisals and arrange for the necessary testimony of real estate experts and others, if the hearings are efficiently conducted, at a cost of from \$2,000.00 to \$3,000.00.

I have repeatedly attempted to interest Rensselaer's representatives on the Board of Supervisors but to date have not succeeded in having them attend any one of the several conferences arranged for. As you know, a special meeting of the Common Council was held to consider this matter and a quorum failed to attend. The equalization commission has actively campaigned against the prosecution of these appeals. As a matter of fact, they have on several occasions stated that your Common Council had no intention of going through with these appeals and they have raised the question so often before the State Tax Commission that the commission has requested in effect that your Council either reiterate its intention of prosecuting these appeals by the appropriation of the necessary funds, or arranging for a discontinuance of the proceedings prior to the next adjourned hearing of the commission to be held June 20th, 1936.

Dear Sir

I appeal to you all for my
lawfull rights as I believe all lawfull
—Citizens has a right to appeal to you for
protection under such Municipal laws
governed by the State of New York and I
appeal to your excellency to do me justice
and show no favors in this instance to
no body irrespective of what influence
they ^{may} have otherwise I am compelled to do this
openly even though it will gain exposure and
notoriety and as I have been trying my utmost
since May 11th in a quiet none exposure way to
get proper results but for some unknown
reason it evidently seems to me that I
cannot get my lawfull rights as a lawfull
citizen over a unlawfull "squatter" who is
blocking my way in the most defiant way
possible by taking unto himself the

(2) Combined power of the Hon. Mayor and the Hon. Board of Alderman of the City of Renss. and something that you would not do owing to the fact that this street — (LOVE-ST.) ~~that~~ I am about to describe is not in a state of condemnation and never was and has been on the chart since (1852 or before) and has always been open to the public up to several years ago when this Mr. Jos. Heffernan closed this street up entirely for his own use and purpose by building a large Chicken house on this street and erecting barricades etc. on this street and back of all this he is planting which closes this street entirely and he even went so far as to go over on the Minnock's lot on the south side and by closing this street he devaluates Albert's and the Minnock's property which we have been paying big taxes for for years and which is valuable land for building purposes with this street kept open as it should be according to law. Of course some parts of this street for the last several years has grown brush and along with these unlawfull barricades which blocks this street ^{it} has become a menace

(3) of a fire hazard which is no fault of mine as you have public safety men to look after such condition's, but no doubt they overlooked it I am not supposed to be an informer but this thing has become unbearable to allow an unlawfull "squatter" to close up a public thoroughfare for his own use and purpose and I put in my protest on May 11th and this "squatter" is still there more defiantly than ever. The Hon. Mayor told me he had the Corp. Council serve legal papers on him to vacate. Well if he did he is still out there back of his fortifications working in his "squatter's" garden more defiantly than ever with no respect for himself or the so called law. There is no Municipal law in the state of New York or elsewhere that would allow such a disgraceful condition, they would compell him to vacate immediately and reprimand him that if he does it again they would put a heavy fine on him or put him in jail. But perhaps he and Mr. Ballantine would like to have this street closed to save there face by buying in as they think their part at the expense of Minnock's and Albert's and spoil the valuation of ovr property which

(4) we have been paying big taxes on for a good many years which counts for a whole lot and also that the Minnock's and Albert's own by a great deal more or much ^{greater} amount ^{of} taxed land that border upon this street which is a majority protest and simply because they are permitted to spoil this street that is no criterion that this unlawfull practice should continue. I put in my protest with Mr. Earle Waugh on May 11th and also a request and stated facts to him and also at a latter date and each time he promised me he would start the men to work the next day of clearing out the street and that he would notify Mr. Jor. Heffeman to vacate and on this date he inspected and saw these unlawfull conditions but I got no action, so I took it up with Mayor Wright May 18th also May 25th also June 7th also June 25th and the best I could get was the brush cleared out up as far as the blockades which is a little more than $\frac{1}{2}$ the length of the street which cost but a very little as 1 man did it in 2 days with the aid of a truck & driver just part time carting it away. And the unlawfull blockades are in the same place and if this "squatter" would be compelled to vacate as he should this other less than $\frac{1}{2}$ way

(5) Can be done for about the same cost or less as Mr. — Earle Waugh gave his word of honor he would do in the presence of my wife, and grant me my request and protest but I have waited most patiently to build my 2 Car Garage in the rear of our lot #295 that leads out in this street but it would be impossible to come out and face either way with all these unlawfull blockades in the street. You sanctioned and gave me a permit on June 4th for a 2 Car Garage designating entrance & exit Love Street and I have already made all arrangements to go ahead now what am I to do I am in a fine fix.

The Hon. Mayor inspected this street himself personally and he saw these unlawfull conditions and he said himself it is an awful mess and that the City owns it and they should maintain it (or anyone will agree with him and I take his honor for granted

This public thoroughfare is fully 25 ft. or over in width and has been on the chart since (1852) or before and is and always was called (LOVE ST.) and is not an Alley and has always been open for the public untill it was closed several years ago unlawfull by

Mr. Jos. Hefferman, he knowingly and willfully knew what he was doing as when he bought his property there was a fence in the rear of his yard designating his line from the street which he took

② down himself and built out into this street closing it which was never done before since it has been in existence you have much narrower streets in the City that have been kept open and maintained since they existed and it is no criterion why this street should not be kept open and maintained we have grass or forest fires in rifle range quite often and this vicinity connects and if it is cleared out would afford ^{as it should be it} the fire apparatus to go either way through that street with plenty of space. It isn't so long ago that vehicles passed up and down that street and passed one another with plenty of space I myself drove a vehicle up and down that street and not so long ago. The street should be kept open and not closed and spoil the valuation of our property and the Minnocks simply to satisfy other people who have closed it and hogged it all for themselves this is a public thoroughfare and put there for all and not for a privileged few.

"I am telling you that this street has always been open up to the time several years ago that Heffernan unlawfully closed it something that

never had been done before since the streets been
in existence. On several occasions they made
complaint about our toilet having an odor and
on each occasion your present board of health
doctor examined it thoroughly and pronounced it
Ok. 100% within the law that lets me off.

But we have no personal grievance against them

graining doors and sign painting the other half keeps
me pretty busy and we are not of the troublesome kind
I have never been in court in my life on my own
account or anybody else's and we and our
ancestors have lived here since (1857) and
this is the first time we asked a request for

for anything and I hope it will be the last as we have had more trouble asking for what belongs to us lawfully and — are entitled to.

What I am after is to improve our property and surroundings and in doing so it exposes other people's wrong doings which I had tried my best not to do by taking the matter up with Mr. Earle Waugh and Mr. Wm. Wright and settling the thing on the quiet as Mr. Jos. Heffernan could have moved off quietly at night and saved all this exposure as he is entirely in the wrong he hasn't got one point in his favor.

He certainly invited all this trouble if he didn't, what is he doing out where he don't belong. I will gladly invite one and all of you to come up and see conditions for yourselves before deciding this matter.

"I'll say that man doesn't need any nerve-tonic for the want of nerve I think his nerve-needs to be — checked."

Regulating the construction, installation and maintenance of tanks, apparatus and appliances for the handling and storage of Petroleum and Petroleum-by-Products within the City of Rensselaer, N.Y.

THE CITY OF RENSSELAER IN COMMON COUNCIL CONVENED DOETH HEREBY
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That section 1 of the Ordinance adopted by the Common Council on July 15, 1936, regulating the construction, installation and maintenance of tanks, apparatus and appliances for the handling and storage of petroleum and petroleum by-products in the City of Rensselaer, be amended to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. No tanks, apparatus or appliances for the handling or storage of petroleum or petroleum by-products with a capacity in excess of two thousand (2,000) gallons shall be constructed or maintained within the City of Rensselaer except in that area located in the Ninth Ward, lying westerly of the New York Central right-of-way and southerly of a line drawn parallel to and 900 feet northerly from the boundary line between the property of the Albany Port District Commission and that property now or formerly owned by the Tide Water Oil Sales Service Corporation as extended from said right of way line to the high water line on the easterly shore of the Hudson River.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.

SECTION 3: All ordinances and resolutions heretofore adopted and inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded and repealed.
