Attached please find copy of letter sent you on Aug. 29, 1936, embodying a request for sewage and water in the Eastland Park development.

We, the undersigned, have homes under construction in this section, specifically, on Highland and Lindbergh Avenues, and would much appreciate the continuance of these very necessary improvements.

We have been informed that the water company refuses to lay pipes until after the sewer pipes have been laid, and until after the streets have been graded.

As the lack of water necessitates drawing it from a neighboring house for the use of the masons in constructing cellars, and also, later on, for plastering, and it is necessary for the plumbers to make sewer connections at a very early stage in the building, we would respectfully petition your honorable body to take some action that would speed up the completion of the sewage and water systems.

It is expected that the Schroeder residence will be ready for occupancy by Nov. 1st, and those of Mr. Van Dyk, and Mr. Dutcher by Dec. 1st.

Gentlemen:

In view of the recent agitation and published statements of various officials relative to the proposed sanitary sewer outlet from the Hampton Manor sewer district of the Town of East Greenbush into the South Street sewer of the City of Rensselaer, it appears desirable that this office express its views regarding two of the points of controversy.

Apparently one of the questions that has arisen concerns the adequacy of the South Street sewer to receive the additional flow which would be tributary from the proposed district. This matter has been quite carefully checked and there is no question in our minds but what the sewer is of suitable size to serve not only the South Street section of the city but in addition the area under consideration as the proposed Hampton Manor sewer district.

The second point of discussion appears to be the arrangement under which such a connection from the district would be permitted, that is, whether it would be by franchise or by contract. It has been necessary for this department to review a considerable number of plans under which one political sub-division would provide sewerage service for another and to the best of our knowledge that has always been done as a contract arrangement and between the two governing bodies of the political sub-divisions concerned.

I trust that the city officials will not consider our actions in this matter other than in the most constructive spirit. We are of the opinion that all things considered, the most suitable arrangement for all concerned is for the Hampton Manor sewer district to obtain an outlet into the South Street sewer of the City of Rensselaer, and I trust that such an arrangement can be made.

It is the unanimous opinion of our membership that the entire case should be carefully reconsidered by you before any decisive action is taken. And we firmly believe that the leasing of the right to use the city sewer facilities at the proposed figure (225\$ per annum) is entirely too low and decidedly unjust to the citizens and tax-payers of our city.

Furthermore, may we suggest that, in our opinion, the proper method to determine a fair charge for such service is on a cost per house basis as used by the sewer districts in this vicinity, instead of the flat rate charge contained in the proposed Hampton Manor contract.
