

Dear Sir

Referring to all my previous letters appealing to you to please take action on Jos. Heffernan who is unlawfully obstructing and closing up entirely a Public thoroughfare (LOVE ST.) for the last several years with a large stinking Chicken house built entirely out upon this street which extends out further than the middle of this street and a large pile of old lumber with nails sticking out from some of this lumber and this chicken house and this lumber combined extends the full width of this street and he is planting back of it and Guy Ballatine is out on this street for the last several years and between the 2 of them they connivingly leave a small portion of brush and young-trees grow up between them to act as a shield or a blinder so as to avoid detection and between the 2 of them they are closing this street for their own use and purpose for the last several years.

(2) and all this is a public nuisance and a menace of a fire hazard and a menace to public health. And as I have stated to you in my previous letters that on May 11th 1936 I protested this to Alderman Waugh personally in the presence of my wife and he on this date inspected and saw all this and he promised me immediate action and told me he would start the men the next day clearing out the brush and would notify Heffernan to vacate and open up the street. — I told him that I would like to improve my property and surroundings by building a 2 Car Garage and pointed out to him the location in the rear of my house and I told him that when he put the sewer in on 4th St. I would build another house in the front facing 4th St.

All his promises never materialized so I took the matter up with Mayor Wright on several occasions personally and he came up and inspected the street and saw the unlawful conditions and I also wrote to him on May 18th 1936 also May 25th also June 7th also June 25th 1936 and he promised me action and told me he had the Corp. Council

(3) serve legal papers on Heffernan to vacate way back since May 18th 1936 and all his promises never materialized up to the present time. In May 1936 I put in my request for a (2 car Concrete Garage) entrance and exit (LOVE ST.) and you approved it and gave me my permit on June 4th 1936 and my Garage is erected and completed about (4 months) and it is impossible for me or a tenant to use this Garage in coming in or out without injuring ourselves and damaging a car with all this unlawfull blocking off and closing the street, and Heffernan still continues in blocking off still more by putting eptions still further out on the street which causes ^{me} still more undesirable trouble and protestations to the City officials. Mr. Finkle Comm. of taxation readily acknowledges that Heffernan has no right out on this street and that he has no legal title nor a permit and that he is not paying one penny of taxes on any of these buildings and yet he is holding me up one year in building this garage and now it is completed, it is impossible to come out or in without injuring ourselves or damaging a car untill he is compelled.

(4) to vacate entirely off the street and get back on his own premises where he belongs and allow me to back east in order to face 4th St. — ~~which it is impossible to do.~~

Mr. Finkle told me that Alderman Waugh said that he was going to dead end this street and leave street as it is which would allow these 2 squatters to remain unlawfully out on this street.

This street is not in a state of condemnation and according to law it can't be done and if he attempts anything unlawfully, I will start immediate action and if these 2 squatters are not made to vacate in the near future I will start — action against the City which is negligence on the City's part in not compelling them to vacate and depriving me and all others of our legal rights and privileges from the use of this public street which we always did have and the search along with our deeds calls for an outlet upon (LOVE ST.) bounded on the south side of our house which is Lot No. 294 and No. 295 and we always payed taxes for that privilege and purpose and always had those privileges for the last (80 years) untill these 2 squatters unlawfully closed this street.

I understand that you adopted and passed a resolution directing City Engineer and Corp. Council

(5) to investigate this street and report back at your next following Common Council meeting, but as yet they have failed to comply with your orders and evidently they will continue to lack, if you do not compell them. They are both well aware of the truth and the facts that Heffernan is unlawfully closing this street. On Oct. 7th 1936. Council meeting when Hon. Alderman Whalen asked the City Engineer about the condition of this street he readily acknowledge that Heffernan is unlawfully closing it and when the Hon. Alderman Whalen asked the Corp. Council if he told Heffernan to vacate or served legal papers on him he said no he did not which proves to you and all concerned that there was absolutely nothing done about it. I was to see Mayor Wright on Tues. June 1st 1937 personally and I asked him who it was that was standing in the way of compelling Heffernan to vacate out of the right of way and open the street, and I remarked to Mayor Wright this man Heffernan must have a big political pull back of him, and Mayor Wright readily acknowledged it is Chas. Leverance.

I am quite sure if Heffernan is just told to vacate by the proper authority that he will comply very readily to the law without even going through the trouble of serving legal papers on him.

(c) Gentlemen I do not wish to intrude on you but I appeal to you again as an honorable body and also as the proper authority to please enforce the law, irrespective of political influence and at your earliest convenience please adopt and pass a resolution to direct the Corp. Council to compell both of these (2-squatters) to vacate and which will allow me and all others our legal rights and priviledges which we always did have and are paying tapes for the last (80 years) for that purpose and priviledge. It is impossible for me to use or rent my garage with this street in such impassable and impervious condittion and yet I am heavily taped and will be taped still higher for my garage and in which it is a white elephant the way conditions are at the present time and I get nothing in return in comparison for the epcessive amount of tapes I am compelled to pay.

We have no modern facilities in 4th Street below Fowler Ave, not even enough electric light of a dark night to find our door and yet we are compelled to pay a general tap proportionately

(7) the same as all other taxpayers who have all these facilities and which we have none, and yet we are situated in the center of the city.

Gentlemen this man Heffernan has closed this street (3 times) this is the third time and worse than ever the first time was in Mayor Adams' time when Mr. Southwell was Comm. of Taxation and Southwell put him off for planting and closing off this street, and the second time was in Mayor W. C. Halley time when Mr. Hickey was Comm. of taxation and Hickey put him off for planting and barricading and unlawfully closing this street with barricades of paving stones, old lumber etc. and this is the third time he has nerve enough to go out there and put up a building which is entirely built on this street along with a barricade of old lumber with nails sticking out and which closes off this whole street, with political influence of Chas. Leverance and Alderman Vaughn and Mayor Wright unlawfully upholding him.

I stand ready at any time or place to take an oath and swear to "God" to the whole truth to the contents of this letter or any of my previous letters or personal interviews with Alderman Waugh or Mayor Wright.

Mayor Wright has detained me over one year with his — promises by — telling me he had the Corp. Council serve legal papers on Heffernan to vacate and kept me under that impression, and now he has the nerve to offer to me the absurd and ridiculous lame excuse that the City cannot find any record of ever having accepted (LOVE-ST.) as a street.

The city of Renss. and the County of Renss. officially and the maps and records and the general public always did and does up to the present time and always will accept (LOVE-ST.) as a street and a public thoroughfare and he is well aware of the truth and the facts and I defy him to close it or dead end it.

And yet he stands by all this unjustified time, and punishes me, when I am paying my way with honest dollars in excessive taxes and allows this "squatter" to unlawfully close this whole street with buildings built out entirely upon this street without title, permit or tax

Gentlemen,

In connection with the alterations at the house of Truck No. 1, 42 Partition Street, Rensselaer, N. Y., certain proposed additional work has been brought to my attention. These items and their prices have been checked over and are fair and reasonable.

The old sink in the basement was connected to a waste line which dripped on the ground at the rear of the building. This is contrary to the Sanitary Code. In order to properly dispose of the waste from this sink, owing to the sink being lower than the waste line from the other fixtures in the building, it will be necessary to install a sump pit and a pump to raise the water to the present drain line. This will entail an additional expense of \$85.00 for the pump and pit and \$20.00 for refitting the sink and installing same.

For reinstalling the old gas stove in a new location and re-connecting same, there will be an expense of \$15.00. For reinstalling the gas heater the contractor asks \$12.00.

The present air valves are not suited for the new layout of the heating system and there will be an additional charge of \$6.00 for new automatic relief valves.

In summation, the items above are as follows:	
Sump pump and pit, etc.	\$85.00
Reinstalling sink	20.00
Reinstalling gas heater and tank, etc	12.00
Reinstalling gas range,	15.00
New air valves	6.00
Total	<u>138.00</u>

All these items are necessary and are hereby recommended. The balance of the work is completed and final estimated will be issued within the new two or three days.

It will be necessary to pass a resolution authorizing this work and I would recommend that this be done as soon as possible, in order that the building may be fully completed and delivered to you this week.
