Dear Sir:

As Chairman of a committee appointed by the Rensselaer Junior Chamber of Commerce, I would like to submit to you, and through you, to the Common Council, two projects for your approval.

First: to erect "street markers" on the principle streets of the city; those streets covered by bus service. This proposal to be considered only if the city treasury warrants the expenditure. By this I mean, the cost of the signs themselves. My idea was to make this a WPA project for work during the winter.

My second proposal would require little or no expense on the part of the city. It is for the removal of tree stumps throughout the city; those that are left standing along the curb line. This project, also WPA, would be almost entirely labor, which I believe can be charged to WPA. The only expense to the city would be leveling off the land after the removal of the stumps and the disposal of them. Both of these expenses are negligible in comparison to the benefit derived by the city from the removal of these unsightly stumps.






