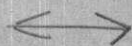

Gentlemen:

I have read with some interest a letter from Alderman Waugh recently published in a local newspaper. While the letter is fundamentally a criticism of my recent veto of the Alderman's Sunday movie ordinance, I interpret it also as a complaint against the conduct of public dancing and the two amusement concessions now operated on Bonacker's Island. For this reason I feel it proper to bring the matter to your attention with the recommendations hereinafter set forth.

In the first instance I wish to make it clear that while the conduct of these amusements are furnishing a perfectly proper and wholesome means of amusement, the operation of such amusements in the vicinity of numerous homes results in considerable annoyance to the residents.

Contrary to the Alderman's statements that this matter has proceeded without interruption, I would advise that I endeavored to correct the situation when it first arose. I did succeed in having the merry-go-round removed to a more distant location on the island. At the same time I requested the operator to visit our City Judge for the purpose of convincing him that a violation of our ordinance prohibiting carnivals would result. Together we did visit the City Judge and after studying the ordinance he advised us that it was not sufficiently broad to prohibit such amusements. Likewise, he advised us that in his opinion the conduct of such amusements on Sunday did not constitute a violation of the law.

Further than this I also discussed the matter with the Alderman of the particular ward wherein these amusements are being conducted and have suggested to him that the remedy, if any, lies with the Common Council.

Although most of your Board is undoubtedly familiar with its authority, I would respectfully call the attention of Alderman Waugh and of any of the newer members of the Board who are not familiar with the provisions of Section 80 of the City Charter to the fact that such section

delegates to the Common Council the authority to enact ordinances for the preservation of the peace and good order of the community and to the regulation or prohibition of exhibitions and entertainments; as well as to the provisions of Section 52 which not only authorizes but also makes it the duty of any alderman to himself arrest or to cause the arrest of all persons violating in his presence the laws of this state or the ordinances of this city. I gladly assure each and every member of your Council that you will have my whole-hearted cooperation in any honest and proper effort which may be made along this line.

I therefore again recommend that your Council enact a suitable ordinance which will properly and effectively correct the condition referred to.



Gentlemen:

I have read with much interest Mayor Wright's Letter Dated September 6th 1939 relating to the Public dancing, and the two amusements concessions on Bonacker's Island and to which I referred to in my open letter to the press as a miniture carnival consisting of a Merry-go-round, Scooter Bikes and Jitter-bug Dancing.

In Paragraph Two of his letter he admits it is of considrable annoyance to the residences of that section.

Why didnt he (Mayor Wright) have the annoyance removed in accordance with the Ordinances governing this sort of amusement.

Mayor Wright's Letter also states that ~~the~~ he had the Merry-go-round moved back on the Island to a more distant point. (1)

This in itself was sufficient evidence that it was a nuisance or an annoyance to the people in that vicinity.

In as much as the Mayor admits that this is of considerable annoyance to the people in the vicinity of Broadway or Bonackers Island may I ask why he did not stop this Show or Exhibition in accordance with the Ordinance I mentioned above, a Copy of which is hereto attached.
