WHEREAS: This Common Council, pursuant to the provisions of resolution 206 as adopted 20 day of September, 1939, duly provided for the construction of a storm water sewer and appurtenances on Aiken Avenue from the Hudson River to Columbia Street.

; and

WHEREAS: James J. Rigney ^{partially} the contractor to whom the aforesaid contract was awarded has completed said contract at a total cost of \$ 27,454.57, of which there is to be retained in accordance with the provisions of said contract price the sum of \$ 3066.16 ~~and~~ and a deduction of \$6983.49 previously paid leaving a balance of \$ 17,374.92 of which sum ~~the inspector~~ ~~\$227.24~~ is due the inspector and \$ ~~17,147.68~~ *186.37* is due the contractor at this time. *\$17,158.55*

; and

WHEREAS: It was duly provided that the expense of completing said contract be defrayed by the issuance and sale of bonds and pending the issuance and sale of bonds, by the issuance and sale of bond sale certificates of indebtedness; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED: That the City Treasurer be and she hereby is authorized and directed to negotiate at private sale a bond sale certificate of indebtedness in the said sum of \$ 17,374.92 dated the 7 day of December, 1939, or such later date as said City Treasurer may determine, bearing interest at a rate of not to exceed $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum both principal and interest to be payable 7 day of June 1940, and that said certificate shall be issued in registered form and shall be subject to earlier call for payment at the option of the city upon ten (10) days notice in writing to the registered holder; and be it further

RESOLVED: That said bond sale certificate of indebtedness shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the Rensselaer County Bank and Trust Company, Rensselaer, New York, with New York exchange and shall be signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk, and sealed with the corporate seal of the city, and otherwise shall be in such form and contain such recitals as the officer executing the same shall determine; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the said bond sale certificate of indebtedness shall be sold by the City Treasurer at private sale for not less than par at the best rate of interest obtainable, not exceeding the rate above specified and the proceeds of the sale thereof shall be applied solely to the purpose aforesaid and that said certificates of indebtedness shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale of bonds to be authorized by the Council for such purpose.

the City and the cancellation of said outstanding Certificate; and be it further,

RESOLVED, That said Special Certificate of Indebtedness heretofore authorized to be issued in the sum of 635.15

shall be redeemed out of the proceeds of the collection of the assessments theretofore levied in connection with the aforesaid improvement, or if the proceeds from the collection of said assessments shall not be sufficient for the payment of said certificate, that then and in that event a tax be levied upon all of the taxable persons and property of the City of Rensselaer, except as otherwise provided by law for the payment of any deficiency.
