PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS,  
REMONSTRANCES AND COMMUNI-  
CATIONS.

Hon., Mayor Younghans and Members of the Common Council  
Rensselaer, N. Y.  
Gentlemen:-

We, the members of the Civic Club wish to take exception to most of the statements made in the petition and letters addressed to you in regard to existing conditions in the Children's playground on upper Second St., as false and feel they have been made without the proper foundation and investigation.

We are a body of self-respecting citizens and wish to state that we neither conduct nor aid a playground or any other institution which is dangerous to the health, welfare and morals of the children.

An occasional misdeemeanor on the part of a child although undesirable and disapproved does not make insanitation. An occasional quarrel or profane word, though unsanctioned, does not make the playground a menace. if there are boys in that section who are so corrupt that their presence should not be tolerated on the playground, we have not met them and it should be the duty of those citizens who know they exist to report the same to the proper authority.

The City Officials gave us that park as the only available space for a playground. We admit that it is near the houses. We admit that at times it is dusty. We admit the noise may be annoying. Under no consideration will we admit that an abominable condition prevails, that it is undanitary as the term is commonly used, that it is dangerous to the welfare of the children, or that it is a menace to their morals.

When the playground is attacked along these lines, it reflects on the character of the supervisor and the members of the Civic Club and we therefore wish to deny the allegation and to register our most vigorous protest.

Therefore, gentlemen, if you are considering the removal of the playgrounds, we ask you to consider it only upon legitimate evidence - namely nearness to homes, dust and noise.
