The Mayor stated that the object of the hearing was to hear those wishing to speak for or against the following Local Law.

"A LOCAL LAW IN RELATION TO PUBLIC HEARINGS BEFORE THE MAYOR ON LOCAL LAWS"

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the  
City of Rensselaer as follows:

Section 1. Whenever a local law after its passage by the Common Council shall be presented to the Mayor for approval, he shall forthwith fix a date for a public hearing concerning such local law and give public of the time and place of such hearing to be given. Such notice shall be given by publication once in the official newspaper of the City. Such hearing shall be held not earlier than five days after the date of publication of such notice. Such notice shall contain the title of the local law and an explanatory statement concerning the same. The Mayor shall attend at the time and place appointed for such hearing and afford an opportunity for a public hearing concerning such local law. Such hearing may be adjourned from time to time, but an adjournment, shall not operate to extend the time of the Mayor to approve such local law or return it to the Common Council with his objections, pursuant to the city home rule law.  
Section 2. This local law shall take effect immediately.

The Mayor stated that if any one present wished to speak against the law they would be given the privilege of the floor.

There being none.

The Mayor stated that if any one present wished to speak in favor of the local law they would be given the privilege of the floor.

There being none the Mayor declared hearing closed.
