Adjourned Meeting,

The Council convened at 8:30 o'clock P. M. and was called to order by Mayor James W. Adams,

The roll being called the following answered to their names.

The Mayor Stated that the object of the meeting was to hear those wishing to speak on the proposed bridge at Third Avenue and the closing of Second Avenue, which ~~was~~ plans were submitted ~~by~~ the Public Service Commission, and to be returned with any suggestion that may be made.

Mr D. Flanigan, Mr W. H. Keenholts, Mr Hyde, Mr F. Thomas, Mr James Guilfoil and Mr James Guilfoil, and City Engineer spoke and made suggestions as to the doing away of the Second Avenue crossing.

Mr Keenholts suggested that a bridge be built at Second Avenue and an underpass at Aiken Avenue and if underpass could not be built at Aiken Avenue that a foot bridge be built over tracks, or if bridge could not be built at Second Avenue at stairs be built to bridge on East Street, a foot bridge at Second Avenue, and under pass at Aiken Avenue or foot bridge.

Mr Michael Guilfoil moved that it be suggested to the Public Service Commission that a bridge be built at Second Avenue instead of Third Avenue,

The Mayor suggested that those present vote on the question by raising their hands,

Ayes, - - - - - 8  
Noes, - - - - - 10  
The Mayor declared motion lost.

It was suggested that the following be added to the plans as submitted Underpass or bridge at Aiken Avenue, Steps at Second Avenue and ~~stairs~~ stairs to bridge on East Street, and the changing of approach to bridge on Third Avenue.

Mayor asked if there were any others present wishing to speak on the subject,  
There being none the Mayor declared hearing closed.
