of the City of Rensselaer, N. Y.

I hereby make claim against the City of Rensselaer, N. Y. for damages to tire in the amount of \$25.00 which was new, and had run only 50 miles, for the following reason,

On Wednesday July 21st 1926, at about 8:00 o'clock P. M. while proceeding westerly on Columbia Street, and without any warning, or any notice on the part of the City of Rensselaer, that any bad condition existed on said thoroughfare, and without any negligence on the part of the claimant, I was suddenly forced into a depression in the said street by a passing automobile, said street having been torn up at the intersection of Columbia and Washington Streets by contractor repaving said street and leaving a jagged condition in the Columbia Street paving which jagged condition ruined a brand new tire, as stated above and of which the claimant believes the City of Rensselaer is directly responsible.
