Resolved that this Common Council hereby declare its intention to discontinue that portion of Riverside Avenue in this City bounded as follows: beginning at the intersection of said Riverside Avenue with the north property line of the Albany Port District Commission, formerly the property of the K. VanRensselaer Arnold Estate; and running thence in a southerly direction for a distance of one thousand four hundred fifty-(1450) feet, more or less, as shown on the plan of the Albany Port Commission nukbered F31, and be it further

Notice is hereby given in pursuance to a resolution duly adopted by the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer on October 1927, that the Common Council of the City of Rensselaer has declared its intention to discontinue that portion of Riverside Avenue in the City of Rensselaer, N. Y. bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of said Riverside Avenue with the north property line of the Albany Port District Commission, formerly the property of the K. VanRensselaer Arnold Estate; and running thence in a southerly direction for a distance of One Thousand four hundred fifty (1450) feet, more or less, as shown on the plan of the Albany Port Commission Numbered F31, and that a hearing be given by the Common Council at its meeting to be held October 18, 1927 at 8:00 o'clock P. M. at the Common Council Chambers in the City of Rensselaer, N. Y. and all persons interested will be given an opportunity to be heard in reference thereto at said time and place.

Whereas, this Common Council did duly declare its intention to construct concrete culvert bridges over Mill Creek in Second Avenue at its intersection with Ring Street, and in Partition Street between Fifth Street and Sixth Street over Quackendary Creek in the City of Rensselaer, N. Y. and directed the City Engineer to prepare suitable maps, plans, profiles and specifications for the making of said improvement, and prepare and present an estimate of the cost thereof; and

Whereas, the City Engineer in pursuance to said resolution so adopted by this Common Council did prepare maps, plans, profiles and specifications for the doing of said work, and such maps, plans, profiles and specifications have been duly approved by this Common Council and this Common Council did adopt a resolution providing for the doing of said work and providing for the payment of the expense of said improvement as estimated by the City Engineer, and this Common Council duly directed the City Clerk to advertise for and receive sealed proposals for the doing of said work; and

Whereas, the City Clerk did publish said advertisement in the paper and at the times and in the manner as directed by this Common Council, and proposals for the doing of said work have been duly opened, tabulated and considered; now therefore be it

Resolved that the constructing of concrete culvert bridges over Mill Creek in Second Avenue at its intersection with Ring Street, and in Partition Street between Fifth Street and Sixth Street over Quackendary Creek in the City of Rensselaer, N. Y. be done in accordance with the resolution do adopted by this Common Council, and in accordance with the maps, plans, profiles and specifications heretofore duly approved and adopted by this Common Council; and be it further

Resolved that the proposal of George Dunn in the aggregate sum of \$15626.50 estimate for the constructing of concrete culvert bridges over Mill Creek in Second Avenue at its intersection with Ring Street, and in Partition Street between Fifth Street and Sixth Street ~~and~~ over Quackendary Creek in this City, be and the same is hereby accepted; and the said George Dunn being the lowest responsible bidder for the doing of said work, be it further

Resolved that the Mayor of this city be and he is hereby authorized, empowered and directed in the name and on behalf of this City to enter into a contract duly approved by the ~~Board of~~ corporation counsel with the said George Dunn for the doing of said work in accordance with said resolution so adopted and the said maps, plans, profiles and specifications; the contract to be in the form now before this Common Council and to be sealed with the corporate seal of this City; however, that the said George Dunn execute and deliver to the city a bond as specified in said specifications.
