Bids must warrant the said hose to do good and sufficient service for at least three (3) years from date of delivery and must further warrant said hose against mildew, rot and decay, and from any defects in manufacture and must agree to replace or repair such hose free of charge on return of the defective lengths.

Bids for both single and double jacket hose will be received, the board reserves the right to contract for either or both.

Samples of hose and specifications of same together with the manufacturers guarantee must accompany all bids.
