Mr Sullivan has handed me the notice containing resolution of Alderman Sedgwick,

Upon investigating this matter I find that the present fence on the Sullivan property has been there 20 years and that it replaced a fence which was on the same line some time prior to the year 1886.

When Broadway was first paved, the south curb line of 4th Avenue was north of this fence. The present curb line was put in when Broadway was repaved.

The record does not show any title in this street. ~~It is xxxxxx~~ ~~xxxxxxx~~ in the Village of Greenbush or in the City of Rensselaer.

The title that the City of Rensselaer now holds to this street is by use and occupancy and the property within the line of the fence of Mr Sullivan has never been used for street purposes.

If the city has a title to any portion of this land, we will be only to glad to take up the matter with the authorities.

On behalf of Mr Sullivan, I must advise the City that we will hold the City responsible for any damages which Mr Sullivan may sustain by reason of the forceful removal of this fence.
