APPENDIX 4

RHINEBECK HISTORIC SITES

Key to Rhinebeck's identity as a historic town is the preservation of its important places. The Comprehensive Plan now under discussion includes several steps to aid in preservation. Identification of important historical sites within the town is the first step in this process.

As Town Historian, I worked with Mary Ann Johnson of GREENPLAN to provide information for a town-wide historic sites map to be included in the Town of Rhinebeck Comprehensive Plan. The website www.rhinebeckplan.org offers the plan's various chapters and provides an opportunity to view maps accompanying the plan, including the Historic Sites Map.

RHINEBECK'S NATIONAL LANDMARK DISTRICT

The Hudson River National Landmark District covers the whole western portion of the town. The district outline is shown on the map while numbers identify parcels within the district which include significant structures as described in the National Landmark nomination documentation.

Information collected to provide background for the nomination was printed and prepared in three ring binders. These binders with pages for each property within the nomination are available at the Starr Library, the Rhinebeck Town Hall, and the Hudson River Heritage office. Within the binders, tax parcel numbers from 1979 are used to identify properties in the landmarks district. Unfortunately, some tax parcel numbers have changed in the years since the nomination was prepared. This occurred when a property was sold or subdivided. When researching a property, that may have changed numbers, it will be necessary to obtain some tax assessment history. It is useful for individual home owners to understand how to use the nomination information to obtain property information.

Individual parcel nomination pages provide information about all of the buildings on the parcel and identify those, which are contributing structures. These are the significant buildings, which should be protected to maintain the district.

NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES

Several sites in Rhinebeck have been individually listed on the National Register of Historic Places. These sites are shown in gold on the map. Among others, they include the Stone Church (St. Peter's), the Quitman House parsonage, and the Palatine Farmstead. The Sands House is on the National Register although the main house has been destroyed by fire. A small colonial stone house still stands on the property. Information about these sites may be found on the register's website, www.nr.nps.gov.

MULTIPLE RESOURCE DISTRICT

A nomination of 37 sites designated as a Multiple Resource District was accepted for the National Register from Rhinebeck. This "district" included significant sites throughout the town. Some of these sites are now within the National Landmark District causing them to be listed with two designations. The Multiple Resource sites may be found individually listed on the National Register webpage. A three ring binder was prepared with photographs and

nomination information about each of the sites. The Starr Library and the Town Hall have copies of these binders. Individual pages, filed at the Quitman House Resource Room may also be consulted.

LOCAL HISTORIC SITES

Some buildings, surveyed for the National Register are significant locally but were not selected for National Register nomination. Properties with local significance are shown on the map in blue. These properties should be studied more thoroughly and action taken by the Town of Rhinebeck to recognize the importance of these buildings.

A committee will be formed to review the information about these sites and provide additional information. Probably the next step would be to notify owners of the sites and ask to verify information. Following this, a public hearing and designation by the Rhinebeck Town Board of these local sites could take place.

MAP IMPORTANCE

The map serves as a planning tool, highlighting properties, which add historic value to the town. Planning and development decisions for the town should be ever mindful of how these treasures will be impacted by decisions being made. We should be striving to protect the sites, using them in a way that will not diminish their beauty and significance.

HISTORIC PROPERTIES NARRATIVE

The Town of Rhinebeck lies in the heart of the Hudson River Valley, an area rich in the early history of the United States. Dominant in this history is the Livingston family and the vast expanse of land it occupied. In 1686, Robert Livingston, aristocrat of the highest nature, used his influence with the English crown to obtain 160,000 acres of land lying on both sides of the Hudson River. Members of the Livingston family shared in those acres. Before the dawn of the 20th century, in the counties of Dutchess and Columbia, as many as forty estates had been established by his descendants, either by birth or by marriage. In the precinct of Rhinebeck large estates lined its western border. Much of that estate land remains today in parcels of a hundred acres or more.

Also as early as 1686, in the present day hamlet of Rhinecliff, the family of Kip became owners of 155 acres of land. Two of the family's three stone houses still stand on the original property. The Kips had the first chartered ferry service on the Hudson River. The land to the north of the stone houses, all known as

Ankony after the principal sachem from whom the land was purchased in 1686, later became the site of a grand manor house and show barns, purchased in 1935 by Allan A Ryan, a two-term Senator for the State of New York. During his tenancy one of the foremost Aberdeen Angus breeding farm operations in the Country was located there. On the southern portion members of the Kip family resided for over two hundred years.

Two and a half miles north of Ankony, at today's border between Red Hook and Rhinebeck, Schultz's/Mills Landing, provided a port where early farmers brought their produce to be carried by sloops to other ports on the Hudson River. Located just to the south was property owned and developed in 1848 by brothers, William and Charles Wainwright, both high ranking officers in the Civil War. The Wainwright estate of over 500 acres became one of the most impressive properties along the river when numerous buildings of stone were constructed to house the family, tenant farmers, livestock and equipment. The farm buildings and tenant houses stand today as a testament to the quality of their construction. The estate's great expanse of flat farm fields visible along River Road rightfully gave it its name of "The Meadows."

In the 1800s, Louis Ehlers, a practitioner of romantic landscapes, gardener, architect to estate owners and a personal friend of William Astor, lived at Clifton Point just north of William Astor's Ferncliff. In addition to Ferncliff, his hand was also evident in the design of landscapes at Rokeby, given by John Jacob Astor I to his daughter, Margaret, at the time of her marriage to General John Armstrong.

William Astor, grandson of John Jacob Astor I, purchased a hundred acres of scrub land bordering the river road in 1855. With the help of Louis A. Ehlers, he immediately exercised a design plan for the construction of buildings and plantings of trees, flowers and shrubbery. By 1882, the estate had grown to encompass more than 500 acres., including a mile and a half of river frontage. Strategically placed amid sweeping lawns and extended drives were a mansion, racing stables, conservatories, dairy barns and numerous tenant houses. When the estate passed on to William's son, John Jacob Astor IV, new construction continued. In 1904 a Casino designed by McKim, Meade and White boasted of the Country's first indoor heated swimming pool, a squash court and an indoor tennis court. A new Norman style dairy complex, designed by Harrie T. Lindeberg, in 1915 and completed by the architectural firm of Charles Platt in 1917, replaced the early dairy barns. The tradition of purchasing land to enlarge the estate was also carried on until, in 1928 under Vincent Astor's ownership, 2,800 acres and numerous farms had been amassed. Today, the Casino and dairy complex still stand on the land first improved by William Astor. They are two of Rhinebeck's proudest possessions.

South of the hamlet of Rhinecliff in 1811, Maturin Livingston, a son-in-law of New York State governor, Morgan Lewis, built a stately mansion commanding an excellent southerly view of the Hudson. His expansive property stayed in his hands for only a short time before it passed through numerous owners to eventually be purchased by William Kelly, a wealthy New York City merchant. Mr. Kelly kept the original house but transformed the grounds into a magnificent park, which he opened to the public during week days. For thirty years he devoted much of his time to the welfare of Rhinebeck and New York State. He served as a State Senator, ran for Governor, founded the First National Bank of Rhinebeck, and in 1862 became the first President of the Starr Library, serving until his death in 1872.

In 1886, Ellerslie, so named by Mr. Kelly, became the property of Levi P. Morton, soon to be Vice President of the United States. Mr. Morton immediately hired famed architect Richard Morris Hunt to set about building a new mansion and huge barns. Mr. Morton expanded the accomplishments of Mr. Kelly by turning the estate into a working farm with a

prize herd of cows. It was classified a "model farm" with all the most scientific dairy equipment to date. He carried on the Kelly tradition of opening the land to the public and invited the children of the town to celebrate his birthday until the day he died at age 96.

Ellerslie had the distinction of serving as a Military Academy from the years of 1945 until 1971. The Tudor style Morton mansion set the tone for the campus until it burned in 1950, at which time a more conventional type dorm was constructed.

Freeborn Garretson, prominent itinerant minister of the Methodist Episcopal Church, married Catharine Livingston in 1791. They built and made their home on a large expanse of land across the road south of Ellerslie. The doors of their home were ever open to friends and numerous travelers on the road. They named the main house Wildercliff.

Part of the Wildercliff property was purchased by Thomas Suckley, son of a wealthy real estate investor and manufacturer of hardware goods, who in 1852 built an Italian style villa and named it Wilderstein. His son remodeled the house in the Queen Anne style and hired Calvin Vaux to create extensive gardens and walkways down to the Hudson River. The Suckley family continued to reside there until the death of the last remaining member in 1991. Currently, under the care of a not-for-profit organization, Wilderstein is open to the public on a regular basis and has become another of Rhinebeck's proudest possessions.

At the southern tip of the town of Rhinebeck, where the Landsman Kill empties into the Hudson, lies one of the earliest of the Rhinebeck estates. In the late 1700s, Dr. Thomas Tillotson, who had served as Surgeon General in Washington's army, acquired one of the earliest mills on the Landsman Kill, and he and his wife, Elizabeth Livingston, established their estate of Linwood. A century later Linwood became the summer residence of wealthy beer brewer, Jacob Ruppert. He encouraged one of his contemporaries to purchase the adjoining property, and Wyndcliffe, the Norman style castle built in 1853 by Livingston descendant, Elizabeth Schermerhorn Jones, became the property of Andrew Finck.

Inland from the river on the southeastern border of Rhinebeck, Morgan Lewis, a member of the Continental Congress in 1776, signer of the Declaration of Independence, Quartermaster General in the Revolution, Governor of New York State and married to Gertrude Livingston, became the owner of most of the land east of the Landsman Kill. It was the portion between the Landsman Kill and the King's Highway (Route 9) that became the estates of Foxhollow and Glenburn. North of these properties stands Grasmere, originally built c1775 by Janet Livingston and her husband General Richard Montgomery. General Montgomery left his wife to oversee construction of the house while he successfully led his troops north through Montreal to Quebec, where he met his untimely death, the first American general to fall in the Revolutionary War.

These estate properties, constituting Rhinebeck's portion of the Hudson River National Landmark District represent the most concentrated estate area along the entire Hudson River. Their views to the west, with the Hudson River and the Catskill Mountains in the distance are exceptionally desirable and continue to make this area an extremely important asset for Rhinebeck and New York State. Sensitive handling of the development of this area

is crucial to maintain the estate atmosphere that lends so much importance to Rhinebeck's historic aspect.
