At the regularly scheduled public meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Rotterdam, held at the John F. Kirvin Government Center, 1100 Sunrise Boulevard, Rotterdam, New York 12306 on Wednesday, April 24, 2024, at 7:00 p.m., the following resolution was duly adopted:

**RESOLUTION NO. 186.24**

**TO ENACT INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO. 7 OF 2024; TO AMEND SECTION 266-46, ENTITLED “SCHEDULE VI: STOP INTERSECTIONS” OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF ROTTERDAM, FOR THE ADDITION OF STOP SIGNS ALONG THE EDGEWOOD AVENUE INTERSECTIONS OF KENMORE AVENUE, MARENGO STREET, AND DELAWARE AVENUE**

**THEREFORE, UPON MOTION OF Councilmember GALLUCCI, seconded by Councilmember DODSON,  
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1.** The Town Board hereby enacts Introductory Local Law No. 7 of 2024.

**SECTION 2.** The Town Clerk is directed, following consultation with the Attorney to the Town, to file said Local Law in final form with the New York State Department of State.

**SECTION 3.** This resolution shall become effective April 24, 2024.

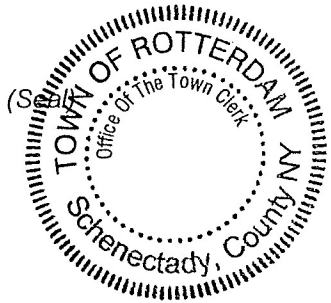

**RE:** Stop signs on Kenmore Ave, Marengo St, and Delaware Ave at the intersection of Edgewood Ave.

COMPLAINT

The Rotterdam Police Department received a traffic related complaint from a resident of the Town of Rotterdam, regarding concerns he has for vehicles not stopping on Kenmore Ave, Marengo St, and Delaware Ave, all at their intersections of Edgewood Ave.

The resident states he and his family have observed on numerous occasions vehicles taking left and right turns off of the mentioned cross streets onto Edgewood Ave, without stopping and almost striking pedestrians walking in the area. The resident further stated he has observed road rage incidents due to the intersections having no traffic control.

SURVEY

A visual traffic survey of the roadways was completed on 03/19/24.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion, I recommend that stop signs be installed at all of the noted intersections. The area has a reasonable amount of vehicular traffic, along with pedestrians, and they are the only intersections that meet Edgewood Avenue that have no traffic control devices. It would further the safety of the community if the town installed stop signs to prevent any right of way issues and accidents from occurring. The stop signs should be installed at the end of Kenmore Ave, Marengo St, and Delaware Ave where they meet with Edgewood Avenue only.
