SCHOOL BUILDING & TUTTLE BLOCK PROJECT

- HTRC SUMMARIZED RENOVATIONS AS DESCRIBED IN ATTACHED LETTER & PROJECT BUDGET.

RENOVATIONS AT IHM SCHOOL WOULD CREATE 19 NEW UNITS OF PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING - LONG TERM AFFORDABLE HOUSING W/ SERVICES ON SITE.

RENOVATIONS AT TUTTLE BLOCK WOULD ADD THREE 1 BR APTS THERE, & THE HTRC OFFICES WILL MOVE ELSEWHERE IN RUTLAND.

DISCUSSION RECOGNIZED THE NEED OF THE UNITS, APPRECIATED THE USE OF IHM BUILDINGS, & ACKNOWLEDGED HTRC ONGOING WORK & SUCCESS IN OUR COMMUNITY.

ALDERMAN WHITCOMB MOVED TO RECOMMEND TO THE FULL BOARD THAT THE CITY APPLY TO THE VERMONT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR UP TO \$750,000 FOR THE PROPOSED HTRC PROJECT, AS WELL AS SCHEDULE THE REQUIRED PUBLIC HEARING & AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO SIGN.

2. COLLEGE OF ST JOSEPH ZAMIAS APPLICATION - CST, IN PARTNERSHIP WITH VERMONT WORKS, INC & VERMONT INNOVATION COMMONS REQUESTED \$50,000 FROM ZAMIAS FUND TOWARDS A 120 DAY FEASIBILITY STUDY LOOKING AT CST'S FUTURE AS AN EDUCATION, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & INNOVATION CENTER. THE ~~PROJECT~~^{STUDY} HAS A TOTAL BUDGET OF \$227,300, WITH VERMONT WORKS, INC COVERING 50%. CURRENTLY, \$50K FROM NORTHERN BORDERS REG COMM, \$10K FROM REDC, \$5K RRA, \$5K FROM INDIVIDUALS HAS BEEN PLEDGED, = \$70K.

DR JENNIFER SCOTT OF CST & DENNIS MOYNHAN OF VT INNOVATION COMMONS PRESENTED THE APPLICATION TO THE COMMITTEE & NOTED A PUBLIC FORUM ON THE PROJECT IS OCCURRING WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 7, 5:30 PM AT THE CST LIBRARY. THE STUDY IS ALREADY UNDERWAY.

DISCUSSION OF THE COMMITTEE INCLUDED SUPPORT FOR THE PROJECT WHILE ALL BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT AGREEING THAT THE ASK OF \$50K WAS TOO MUCH OF THE REMAINING UNCOMMITTED ZAMIAS BALANCE OF \$100K.

ALDERMAN ETTORI STATED IT IS TOO EARLY TO DEVOTE THE FULL \$50K ASK, BUT IT IS IMPORTANT THE CITY INVEST SOMETHING TO IT & SHOW WE ARE WILLING TO TAKE A RISK ON THIS FOR FUTURE SUCCESS AT THE CAMPUS.

ALDERMAN WHITCOMB, ~~WITH~~ SUGGESTED SOMETHING LESS THAN THE FULL ASK & EARMARKED FOR LINE ITEMS NOT INCLUDED SALARY.

THERE WAS GENERAL CONCERN OF OUTSTANDING CST DEBTS, PRESIDENT SCOTT ACKNOWLEDGED THIS AS AN OBLIGATION THEY ~~DO~~ RECOGNIZE & CONTINUE TO WORK ON.

SCOTT & MOYNIHAN ALSO OUTLINED LOCAL EMPLOYER COMMITMENT TO FUTURE USE OF THEIR FACILITIES INCLUDING RRMC, OMYA & OTHERS.

ALDERMAN REVEAL MOVED TO APPROVE \$10K OF ZAMIAS FUNDS TOWARDS APPLIED FOR PROJECT, EARMARKED NOT TO BE SPENT ON PROJECT TEAM SALARIES. PASSED 3-2
