ON HISTORY & MAKEUP OF PENSION MUNICIPAL

THIS WAS THE SECOND MEETING OF
THE PENSION DEFICIT COMMITTEE.

WE ASKED FOR A PRESENTATION OF THE
RUTLAND CITY MUNICIPAL PENSION FROM
TREASURER WILSON.

THE RUTLAND CITY PENSION WAS CREATED
IN 1938, PRECEDING THE CREATION OF VT.
STATE TEACHERS RETIREMENT SYSTEM BY
THE VT. STATE LEGISLATURE IN 1947. CITY
TEACHERS MAY PARTICIPATE IN BOTH
PENSIONS.

UP UNTIL 1995, PARTICIPATING EMPLOYERS
CONTRIBUTED 20% OF SALARY, THE CITY 6%
OF SALARY W/BENEFIT OF 1.50% OF FINAL
AVG. WAGE X NO. OF YEARS EMPLOYEE
CONTRIBUTED TO PENSION.

In 1995, the Benefit was increased to 1.75% of wages and in 2000 2% of wages for all years of service, in other words retroactively, without increasing contributions. At this time up to this time the plan was over 100% fully funded. Consequently, the Actuary urged the City, in March Treasurer Ron Graves, who oversaw the pension, to increase contributions by 3.4% of payroll to keep pace with the enhanced benefits. No changes were made.

Without going into further detail, the pieces were put into place which has led to the present underfunding and the discussion that is currently going on about what to do about the funding. The current funding percentages reported by the Actuary place the School at 12.82%, Municipal at 59.79%, with the overall pension funding at 12.82%.

As many of you know, the City Govt has increased pension contributions thru the budget process. A whole range of options are before us to address the situation.
