LOCAL OPTIONS TAX

TREASURER WILTON DESCRIBED HOW SHE ENVISIONED A LOCAL OPTION TAX MIGHT WORK IN RUTLAND. SHE PROVIDED A SUMMARIZED ANALYSIS & COPY OF RELEVANT STATUTE (ATTACHED).

A LOCAL OPTIONS TAX WOULD PROVIDE 70% OF A 1% STATE ROOMS, MEALS & SALES TAX TO THE CITY. THIS WOULD REPLACE OUR EXISTING RME TAX WHICH PROVIDES ABOUT \$450K REVENUE NOW.

BY THE TREASURES CALCULATION, LOCAL OPTION TAX REVENUE COULD SURPASS THAT OF RME TAX SIGNIFICANTLY ENOUGH TO REDUCE THE MUNICIPAL TAX RATE BY MORE THAN \$.05 WHEN USING FY17 DATA.

THIS WAS PRESENTED FOR BOA CONSIDERATION, NO ACTION WAS TAKEN & THE ITEM REMAINS IN COMMITTEE.

LAZ BUDGET FY18 & CURRENT STATUS OF TRANSIT CENTER FUND

JOHN FROM LAZ PRESENTED BUDGET DISCUSSION INCLUDED CURRENT OPERATIONS ARE MOVING THE DATA IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION THOUGH THE TREASURER CAUTIONED WE STILL HAVE A BIG "DUE TO" TO GENERAL FUND... IF ALL PAYMENTS FROM THE STATE CAUGHT UP, WE ARE STILL BEHIND TO DATE.

MAYOR ALLAIRE REMINDED THE GROUP WE KNEW THIS WAS A MULTI YEAR PATH, THE CITY HAS A LOT INVESTED, WE KNEW THIS WOULD TAKE TIME & WE MUST STAY THE COURSE.

JOHN @ LAZ MENTIONED CUSTOMER COLLECTIONS ARE SLOW & SO REVENUE IS BEHIND. THEY WILL BE RAMPING UP COLLECTIONS SOON.

THE BUDGET AS PRESENTED SHOWS A FY18 LOSS OF \$34.5K. AFTER TAX STATE COVERS $\frac{1}{2}$ THE LOSS & PAYS CITY THE \$50K MANAGEMENT FEE, THAT IS +\$33K FOR THE YEAR.

ALDERMAN ETTORI MOVED TO RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF FY18 LAZ BUDGET AS PRESENTED (ATTACHED).
