At the regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Saratoga, County of Saratoga, State of New York, held on, the following resolution was made as indicated above,

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend the Town's Zoning Ordinance with the addition of allowable uses for Commercial Finishing Shops, under Special Use Permits; and

*WHEREAS*, the Town Board of the Town of Saratoga has held a public hearing and received input from the townspeople; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, by the Town Board of the Town of Saratoga, to adopt Local Law 2 of 2023, adding Commercial Finishing Shops to the Town's Zoning Ordinance.

Section 1 -Article IV of the Town of Saratoga Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by adding the Section 400-16.5 as follows: Commercial Finishing Shops.

§400-34 - Rural District & Rural Residential District (Schedule of Uses and Regulations) is amended to read as follows:
