

Ordinance No. 2026-6226

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA BARBARA APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR TO EXECUTE A PUBLIC UTILITY EASEMENT DEED TO SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON ON CITY OF SANTA BARBARA PROPERTY LOCATED AT THE HARBOR MAIN PARKING LOT

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Barbara (City) owns the property commonly known as 401 Shoreline Drive (APN 033-120-018); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to install electric vehicle charging stations on this parcel and requires electrical service for those stations; and

WHEREAS, a Grant of Easement for the above stated purpose has been prepared by Southern California Edison, has been approved as to form by the City Attorney, and is on file with the City Clerk.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA BARBARA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Public Works Director is authorized to execute a Grant of Easement with Southern California Edison in a form approved by the City Attorney.
2. The Public Works Director is authorized to execute any additional documents, as approved by the City Attorney, necessary or convenient to the grant of the easement and to cause the deed to be recorded in the official records of the County of Santa Barbara.
3. The Public Works Director may delegate the authority granted by this Ordinance to appropriate personnel within the Public Works Department.
